Notes from Fr. Vincent:

Pentecost Sunday

“Bethlehem was God with us, Calvary was God for us and Pentecost is God in us”.

Pentecost literally means 50th. It is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover feast by the Jews and a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus by the Christians. What is Pentecost for us Christians? It's like a full-rigged ship under an unfurled sail makes a beautiful picture, but it does not move without wind. Without "the breath of life," human beings cannot perform. An artist needs inspiration. The "ruah Yahweh"-the breath, animating Spirit, of God was given to us at baptism. At Pentecost, we celebrate the giving of the Spirit to God's people and, related to it, the establishment of the new Israel, the Church.

In the Gospel Jesus reminds his disciples that while he is leaving them, He is not abandoning them. While he was on earth, he was their strength, their advocate with the Father. Now he is going to give them another advocate, another helper they can always rely on, the Holy Spirit. The gospel reading represents John's version of the birth of the Church. The disciples are to continue Jesus' mission from his Father and this mission will, as his, involve judgment. His mission was to bring humankind to the light and to the Father.

Today's feast gives us the assurance that when we continue the mission of Jesus, his preaching, healing and teaching ministry, the Holy Spirit will give us the necessary guidance and strength. Like the first apostles, we are now the soldiers of Christ and witnesses in today's world. May we become aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit in us.

Prayer: Holy Spirit, make me aware of my gifts and enable me to use them to build up my domestic church. Amen.

St. John the Evangelist and St. Anthony, pray for us and protect us.

Adult Education Notes

Continuing with the concepts from the Marian Conference: Give yourself to Mary- for she will lead you, help you, and direct your life to her Son Jesus. Triumph the connection of Mary's obedience to the God who created her. Mary lives and loves to lead us to Christ—Always! Meditate on that!!

Be bold in your proclamation to others! For to follow Christ, we know what we need to do and we need to be about the business of doing it!!

At Offertory when Father is preparing the gifts, prepare for the Consecration and pray for healing. Fr. Geraci said to put what needs to be HEALED in the Chalice because LIFE is in the blood—people, your relationships, your marriage, the ones you love who need healing. On the Paten with the host put what needs to go away - your cancer, all your sicknesses, addictions, to separate that from the lifeblood from the persons who need healed. .

Perpetual Eucharistic Revival—the 70s and 80s ruined the thought of the Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. To get back into the Eucharistic Revival we need to have the courage to do what is right. Sacrifice. We are so stiff-necked and arrogant. This is what the Saints died for. Do not abandon the tabernacle but accompany it. Put your priorities on Jesus and then the fruit will come.

If we truly believed and knew what was in the tabernacle, it would need to be guarded day and night for the august Presence within it. The tabernacle needs to be the FIRST thing your eyes radiate to. It must be the reason you genuflect before it. Altar rails are coming back to the worship of Jesus at Communion. If you are of good health, you should not refuse to kneel because that is arrogance before God. Fill the rails to receive because it is more efficient than lines. For those who receive in the hand, left hand resting open on top of the right hand. Raised chest high as if making a throne. Not separated- not a v-shape. Fingers closed. Don't walk away after receiving in the hand but consume it right there immediately after receiving it in front of priest or minister. There is one case where a lady took the Eucharist home and gave half of it to her DOG! What desecration and blasphemy! Crumbs of the whole Christ everywhere!

The preferred way to receive is on the tongue...but practice this in a mirror with a cracker or the like. Father Calloway has seen these not so nice ways people receive on the tongue so he told us (and demonstrated these No No ways)—

No Gene Simmons-No Attila the Hun-Don't bury your tongue in an open mouth-No lizards-No biting-No lip smacking-No bird feeding (tall people with head held back)-No slot machine (barely open)-so practice a best way of mouth well open with tongue half way out. And however you choose to receive please please say AMEN like you mean it. Not as a passing thought or a secret password or an option but as a declaration that you believe Jesus is there. That's enough to absorb for now. We will talk more next week about St. Joseph the greatest earthly model of a Father that ever was! Fathers are the key to a lasting domestic Church.
