GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

We love to make examples out of those who have erred and done wrong. Publicly punishing others serves as a means of demonstrating the consequences for what is deemed inappropriate or wrongful behavior. While this may appear an effective way of achieving conformity to established rules, it runs the real risk of distorting motivation. Obviously, we want people to do what is right and pursue healthy, virtuous behaviors and ideals. But is fear of punishment ever the best motivation for avoiding one action in favor of another?

Doing something out of fear is never healthy. Focusing exclusively on our behavior and what others expect or think, leads to living life with a self-focused superficiality. We become more concerned about protecting ourselves from something negative and unpleasant, than investing ourselves in the freedom, wonder and awe of being human! We can still find our way to the unacceptable or inappropriate behavior as long as we do not get caught! Being a whole, focused, and God-centered human being requires more. It demands an investment of the heart. Virtuous, moral, and mature lifestyles reflective of the Gospel necessitate love.



When we experience and recognize love, God's unconditional love, in the depth of our soul, we fall in love with what we have found. We then find ourselves leaving destructive and sinful actions behind in search of something more holy, dignified, true, integral, and loving. This is really "mercy realized." God's tremendous, loving, eternal forgiveness and willingness to bring us back to something more real and tender is transformational. The respect for myself that I receive from God is so life changing that it causes me to run quickly away from anything sinful and self-destructive to things that are whole and holy.

There are many people who want nothing more than to judge or criticize us. What would actually stoning the woman caught in adultery really accomplish? Nothing more than the inflation of the already self-righteous egos of a few men who think they have power. They have no power because they are sinners too, just like everyone else. What all of us have is the humble ability to express sorrow for pursuing destructive thoughts and actions and receive the power of God's mercy. Then, Jesus' request to "go and sin no more" will be one we proudly heed and follow.

CUARESMA 2022

Regulaciones de Cuaresma: Miercoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo es un día de ayuno y abstinencia. Ayunar significa que las dos comidas pequeñas del día no son iguales a la cantidad de una comida más grande. La abstinencia es nuestra abstinencia de comer carne. Ambas prácticas nos dan la oportunidad de ser solidarios con los cristianos de todo el mundo y nos recuerdan el sufrimiento de Cristo. Todas las personas de 14 años o más deben abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, todos los viernes de Cuaresma y en Viernes Santo. Todas las personas mayores de 18 años y menores de 59 años deben ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Tambien se nos anima a todos a ofrecer a Dios otros actos de penitencia durante la Cuaresma. No por el "sufrimiento", sino por el amor, que es sacrificio.

Via cruxis: todos los viernes a las 6:00 p.m. en la capilla durante la Cuaresma con una merienda después en el salon parroquial a las 6:30 p.m.. Para convivir con todos durante esta temporada de Cuaresma.



LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Hacer un camino

¿Cuál es tu zona de confort: emocionalmente; profesionalmente; personalmente? Todos tenemos una. Pero ¿te habías dado cuenta de que puedes tener una espiritualmente? Piensa en lo que te gusta y lo que no disfrutas en particular cuando se trata de la iglesia, la oración y la liturgia. Todos tenemos "esos cantos" ante los que arrugamos la nariz, ya sea porque son demasiado modernos o anticuados. Todos tenemos "esas personas" en nuestra parroquia cuyas ideas no nos convencen, ya sea porque están tratando de cambiar demasiado o porque parecen estar siempre mirando hacia el pasado. Además, ¿cuándo fue la última vez que te sentaste del OTRO lado de la iglesia durante la misa?

Por mucho que no queramos admitirlo, incluso (y especialmente) como pueblo de Dios, nos apegamos profundamente a nuestras propias zonas de confort personal, y tendemos a ver a los que están afuera con desconfianza.

Pero ¿y si Dios tuviera una zona de confort? ¿Qué pasaría si Él nos viera, en nuestro pecado y nuestra miseria, como demasiado "lejos" de Él mismo para alcanzarlo? Dichosamente, nuestro Dios es un Dios que "abrió un camino en el mar y un sendero en las aguas impetuosas." Nuestro Dios es un Dios que hace "algo nuevo."

El llamado a la corresponsabilidad exige que miremos más allá de nosotros mismos. Nuestros pensamientos, nuestras opiniones, nuestras preferencias: estas cosas no son importantes para el corresponsable. Incluso si hay un desierto vasto y seco de discordia, o un baldío aparentemente interminable de puntos de vista opuestos entre nosotros y nuestro vecino, Dios nos desafía a "abrir un camino" fuera de nuestra zona de confort, para que juntos podamos anunciar Su alabanza.

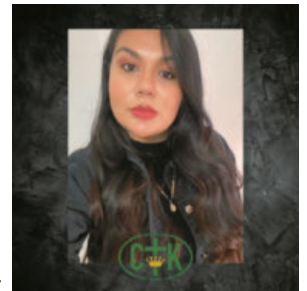
