A Note from Fr. Dan ~


Happy Catholic Schools Week! God bless our students, parents, teachers and staff. Keep up the good work.

Your Envelope Counts-January 29, 2022 - St. Ambrose has three endowment funds which are managed by the Catholic Community Foundation. These funds support the school, religious education, and the church, including care and maintenance of the cemetery. Annually, St. Ambrose chooses to receive 5% of the endowment value to pay for ordinary operating expenses such as staff salaries and benefits, maintenance to the buildings, and utilities. The December 31 distribution was \$25,599. For the first two quarters of the fiscal year, St. Ambrose has received \$51.095 from the Endowment funds to supplement Sunday collections in paying operating expenses of the parish.

San Ambrosio tiene tres fondos de donación administrados por la Fundación de la Comunidad Católica. Estos fondos apoyan la escuela, la educación religiosa y la iglesia, incluido el cuidado y mantenimiento del cementerio. Anualmente, San. Ambrosio elige recibir el 5% del valor de la donación para pagar los gastos operativos ordinarios, como los salarios y beneficios del personal, el mantenimiento de los edificios y los servicios públicos. La distribución del 31 de diciembre fue de \$25,599. Durante los primeros dos trimestres del año fiscal, San Ambrosio recibió \$51,095 de los fondos de donación para complementar las colectas dominicales para pagar los gastos operativos de la parroquia.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

Thursday:

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation

to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. Are we ready to listen and be challenged and stretched?

SAINT OF THE WEEK


You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blasie was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them again the throat, and saying the following prayer

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from allments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Fother, and of the San, and of the Holy Spirit.


