

Stanford. She is planning on sending a detailed account of your gifts in an upcoming bulletin.





Pro-Life and Justice Commission

"And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us..."

"Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all of the creatures that crawl on the ground.' God created man in His image, in the divine image He created him, male and female He created them." (Genesis 1: 26-27)

We were created by God, the last of all of the living creatures that He created. We were not an afterthought; we were always in the mind of God. What distinguishes us from the amazing and beautiful animals who were created before us is that we alone are created in the image of God.

What does that mean? After all, we cannot literally see God. However, we can "see" Him in the beauty of the created world around us. We can "feel" Him in our hearts and in our relationships with families and friends, and we can learn more about Him through our minds, through both reason and faith.

Before the physical universe was created, God had created us in His divine mind. He knew us. Unlike the animals who rely on instinct to guide their lives, man alone was given the power of reason, the ability to think for himself, to make his own decisions. With that gift came the power to either love God or to deny Him, to do good in the world or to choose to do evil. From the beginning, God knew the temptations that this created world would bring. He knew that man would be tempted by a natural tendency toward sin.

God knew all of this before He even began creating the physical world. He knew that we could not do it alone, that we would need a savior. That savior had been with God from the beginning for that savior was God, the Word of God. And so, for the sake of man, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us."

This is the miracle of Christmas, the moment when God entered our world. He did not appear in a blaze of glory so that every creature on earth could see Him and bow down to Him. No, He chose to come as a newborn infant, nurtured in His mother's womb for nine months, just like every other human being. He did not appear as the son of a nobleman or a

great king, destined for a life of luxury. Instead, He was born to a poor Hebrew couple living in the backwaters of the Roman Empire. He was born in a manger in the small town of Bethlehem of Judea, and He was and is the son of God.

We are not an accident of evolution. Jesus showed us through His teachings and through His life that all human life has dignity; every single one of us was created by God. As Catholics, this belief in the dignity of the human person is the foundation of all of our social teachings. As the Catechism says, "Every human life, from the moment of conception until death, is sacred because the human person has been willed for its own sake in the image and likeness of the living and holy God. (CCC 2319)

As Catholics, we are at odds with the modern utilitarian and secular view of man, the main principle of which is individual autonomy. The value of the individual is defined in terms of quality of his or her life and their ability to contribute to society. In some countries, people are even considered "consumer units."

That's why it is so easy for many people today to accept the aborting of babies who have birth defects, of euthanizing the sick or the handicapped or the elderly, all of whom are deemed to be incapable of contributing to society. Instead they are considered to be burdens that the secular world is unwilling to bear.

The teachings of the Catholic Church have always been contrary to abortion and euthanasia. They will not change to suit the views of the secular world around us because we know that all lives have purpose. We are children of a God who loves us so much that He sent His only son to become man and dwell among us. We have been blessed!
