"20 + C + M + B + 22". The numbers refer to the calendar year (20 and 22, for this year); the crosses stand for Christ; and the letters have a two-fold significance: C, M and B are the initials for the traditional names of the Magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar), as well as an abbreviation of the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which means, *May Christ bless this house*. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless our homes and stay with those who dwell in them throughout the entire year.



Did you know?

As yet another year is rapidly drawing to a close, I find myself once again drawn to the mystery of time. It certainly does seem to be on our minds a lot. Sometimes we'll talk about "having all the time in the world" or we'll tell someone, "Take your time." However, most often, we simply don't seem to have enough of it. "I don't have time." "I'm running out of time," or "Time's up." It is a paradox.

Time is God's gift to us. When God created the heavens and the earth, He created Time, and we live our lives in this mystery we call "Time." For thousands and thousands of years, men and women have lived lives which have been ordered by the rising and setting of the sun, by the passage of days, weeks, months, and years, generation after generation.

When we stop to think about the billions and billions of people who have lived and died on this earth since the beginning of time, our individual lives can seem quite insignificant and meaningless except for one powerful fact. Each and every one of us, every human being ever born on this earth, is known and loved by God. That is inconceivable to us. As the Psalmist wrote in Psalm 139, "Lord, you have probed me, you know me: you know when I sit and stand; you understand my thoughts from afar. My travels and my rest you mark; with all my ways you are familiar. Even before a word is on my tongue, Lord, you know it all. Behind and before you encircle me. Such knowledge is beyond me. Too lofty for me to reach."

Tell me more...

As I grow older, I find that I am much more aware that the years of my life are passing too quickly. I find myself drawn to Psalm 90 which speaks so eloquently about the shortness of our lives, verses that are increasingly poignant. Yet I find comfort in these words.

O Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to the next. Before the mountains were born or the earth or the world brought forth, you are God, without beginning or end.

You turn men back to dust and say: "Go back, sons of men." To your eyes a thousand years are like yesterday, come and gone, no more than a watch in the night.

You sweep men away like a dream, like grass which springs up in the morning. In the morning it springs up and flowers: by evening it withers and fades....

Our life is over like a sign.

Our span is seventy years or eighty for those who are strong....

Make us know the shortness of our life that we may gain wisdom of heart. In the morning, fill us with your love; we shall exult and rejoice all our days. Give us joy to balance our affliction For the years when we knew misfortune.

Show forth your work to your servants; Let your glory shine on their children. Let the favor of the Lord be upon us: give success to the work of our hands, give success to the work of our hands.

Life is this wonderful gift that God has given us, but it comes with an expiration date. Although our souls are immortal, our bodies are not. So as we look back at the year that's ending, grateful for the blessings we experienced, let us look ahead to the new year. Once again, it will pass by too quickly, but it too will be filled with lots of wonderful memories and experiences, and likely, a few trials.

Remember...we are on a pilgrimage. Embrace the journey!

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, (Joseph Ratzinger) is 94 years old and wrote a beautiful Christmas letter to Jesus as a child. He wrote the letter at age seven in 1934. According to Italian website <u>Korazym</u>, the letter was found in 2012 during his childhood home's restoration in Bavaria, which was transformed into a museum dedicated to the former pontiff.

"Dear Baby Jesus, soon you will come down to earth. You will bring joy to children. You'll bring joy to me too. I would like the "Volks-Schott," a green chasuble for mass and a Sacred Heart of Jesus. I'll always be good." Joseph Ratzinger Christmas 1934.

The young Ratzinger requested the Volks-Schott missal, which helped him fall in love with the liturgy. He also requested "a green chasuble," because he played a "parish priest's game" with his brother.

"As boys, my two brothers loved to act out the Sunday service," Pope Benedict's sister Maria Ratzinger <u>said in 1991.</u>"We celebrated mass and we had chasubles made by the mother's seamstress just for us," Pope Benedict's brother, Msgr. Georg Ratzinger <u>told Inside the Vatican.</u> "One time, in turn, we were the minister or the altar boy." Lastly, the young Benedict requested the Sacred Heart of Jesus because of his family's devotion to Him.
