

Pro-Life and Justice Commission

Did you know?

Archbishop Salvatore J. Cordileone often finds himself in a very difficult position. He is a conservative Catholic bishop in a very liberal city, San Francisco. When he speaks up for conservative and traditional values, as he often does, he makes the news...and ruffles a few feathers.

The archbishop attracted the media's attention in September, 2021, when he asked "all Catholics and others of goodwill" to join a prayer and fasting campaign for House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, a Catholic who supports legal abortion. Pelosi's congressional district lies within San Francisco. He is her archbishop.

The bill before Congress in September was the Women's Health Protection Act, which, if passed, would legalize abortion at any stage of pregnancy, up to birth, in all fifty states. Although Archbishop Cordileone and Nancy Pelosi are both Catholics, they are worlds apart in their views on abortion, despite the Church's clear views on the issue. However, Archbishop Cordileone does not preach fire and brimstone; instead, he prays for the conversion of her heart. She is not alone in her need for conversion. In his public statement, he also noted, "A conversion of heart of the majority of our congressional representatives is needed on this issue."

Instead of condemning, he chose to look for and see the good in the Speaker. He notes that she "speaks fondly" of her five children and her nine grandchildren. "She clearly has a maternal heart."

Tell me more...

A couple of months later, Archbishop Cordileone was again being quoted, this time in a letter he had sent to the students at Archbishop Riordan High School in San Francisco. Earlier in the year the school had held an all-school assembly featuring a pro-life activist. A number of the students had walked out in protest. This has been a common occurrence, especially on college and university campuses. Too many students today simply do not want to hear views that contradict what they believe. They often claim that having to hear such views makes them feel "unsafe."

The archbishop reacted to their walkout by deciding to meet with student leaders in small groups in early November. However, before the meeting, he sent a letter to all of the students. It was a pastoral letter designed, not to make them defensive, but to get them to stop and think about what they believe and why. It quickly went public, and it is a very powerful explanation of why the Catholic Church is pro-life. Archbishop Cordileone hoped that it might encourage young people to learn to think for themselves.

"Every stage of life has its blessings and challenges, its gifts to offer the broader society and its blind spots. As young people you are idealistic, full of energy to be advocates for justice and changing the world into a better place. It is a joy for me as your archbishop to see this energetic idealism in you..."

"This is a great blessing, and it is a gift that you offer to the rest of us. However, you still have much growing and learning to do; much success and failure, joy and suffering lie ahead of you — and learning as well... My prayer is that you will be open to learning and growing in your knowledge, and especially open to hearing and trying to understand points of view different from your own, even points of view with which you strongly disagree. I wish that is what those of you who walked out of the speech by a pro-life activist recently would have done. This action put on full display one of the blind spots of youth due to young people's lack of life experience: gullibility..."

He continued, "While every generation has valued science...your generation, more than any other in the past, looks to science as a guide for navigating through life. Let's then look at what science has to say about abortion. Abortion is the killing of a human life. This is a scientific fact. The fetus in the mother's womb is a unique, growing human being, with its own unique DNA. The method of killing depends on the stage of pregnancy and type of abortion...no matter the method, abortion is a horrendously violent act...It is a scientific fact.'

"To all of you I say: do not be victims of the culture. There are powerful forces in our country that use slogans to coopt you into being agents of their own self-serving agendas. You must see through the lies. Abortion 'providers' are not for choice: every birth for them is a lost sale."
