Book club review from the November club meeting: Foe by lain Reid

This story takes place not too far in the future--but we aren't told when. Junior and Henrietta, married 5 years, live on an isolated farm--but we don't know where. They seem to be very satisfied with their life, even though "Hen" is not as contented as Junior.

A "government man (Terrance) from an OuterMore project" arrives to tell them that Junior is on the long list for going to an outer space Installation and he will find out in a couple of years if he is selected. Life goes on. Terrance returns to the farm a few times during this 2-year span to see how they are doing—even stays with them for quite a spell.

I had read the book before and really enjoyed it, so I was looking forward to catching clues (which I still missed) and to the expected discussion. Our book club had a very mixed response: 4 really liked it; 2 said a definite No; and the other 3 were on the fence. It's the kind of book that, after you finish, you feel the need to share your thoughts with someone.


