Book club review from the December club meeting:

Book Review of the Nickle Boys

By Colson Whitehead

The author explains his acknowledgments, he learned through the Tampa Bay Times about archaeology students at the University of South Florida who were digging up and trying to identify the remains of students who had been tortured, raped, and mutilated, then buried in a secret graveyard, at the state-run Dozier School for Boys in the Panhandle town of Marianna. Dozier's century-plus reign of terror ended only in 2011, and graves were still being discovered after Whitehead's novel went to press.

The discovery of an unmarked graveyard is an inconvenience both for the real estate company developing an office park on the site and for the state's attorney, who thought his investigation into abuse at the academy was closed.

I really liked this book. It was a great discussion at The Book Club.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING January 12, 2022 Highlights


There was a great deal of discussion on preparing the 2022 budget, working out kinks with our new accounting firm, and keeping good channels of communication open to all members

FIGHTING THE WINTER BLUES WITH SLEEP

Sleep is very important to our mood, mental state, and well-being. Many people's moods are impacted by the season changing and increased darkness. While you might think darkness is beneficial to sleep, having it invade so early can affect sleep quality and result in a loss of energy. As important as it is to get enough sleep—if you find that you are getting more than nine hours of sleep per night and still not feeling rested, talk to your doctor about how you are feeling. Here are some tips to help maintain a healthy sleep/wake schedule:

- Limit your intake of caffeine, alcohol, and nicotine that can interfere with sleep
- Use light to your advantage by exposing yourself to light during the day and limiting light exposure in the evening
- Exercise regularly but not close to your regular bedtime
- Start a calming pre-sleep routine
- Turn your bedroom into a relaxed sleep atmosphere
- * Stop watching the clock while in bed
- * Do no nap close to your regular bedtime
- * Stop using electronics at least 30 minutes
