

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: As we celebrate Labor Day, can you tell me about Catholic teaching regarding labor?

Answer: One of the most important principles of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of work and the rights of workers. Four encyclicals address this foundational social teaching: Rerum Novarum (1891) by Leo XIII, Quadragesimo Anno (1931) by Pius XI, Laborem Exercens (1981), and Centesimus Annus (1991) by John Paul II. They address both the theology and dignity of work. In Genesis, God takes the initiative in creating the world, calling forth human beings to be faithful stewards of creation. We are thus formed to share in God's continuing creative activity by partnering with God in finishing the world and helping bring it to completion and fulfillment. From this perspective, work can be spiritually understood in terms of sharing in God's ongoing activity to build, create, and transform the world. Human beings are co-creators with God. This vocation demands self-discipline.

Besides an exercise in self-discipline, work is also the means by which we develop and fulfill ourselves. In work, we shape the world and our environment. Through work, we also shape ourselves. Pope John Paul II summarized this point in *Laborem Exercens* #6, "the value of work is not primarily the kind of work being done, but the fact that the one who is doing it is a person."

FROM THE PASTOR

In the gospel reading from the gospel of Mark, the story of the healing of the deaf man is told. As Jesus entered the city, some people brought this man to Jesus and begged him to heal him. Cities in Jesus' day were very crowded, and people were often elbow to elbow as they moved about on the streets. The deaf man would have had no access to Jesus as he moved through the city, so the people who brought the man to Jesus were offering tremendous compassion to someone in need. Jesus returns the compassion by first taking the deaf man off by himself, giving privacy, and

healing him. We can learn a lot here, about being an advocate for others who do not have a voice and being humble in our works of charity, not doing so for public spectacle.

- Monday is Labor Day, our national holiday to celebrate the work accomplished. The church has long stood up for the rights of workers and dignity of work.
- The school year is off to a good start; pray for the continued success as the year progresses.

From Pope Francis

In a brotherly spirit, I join in this message of hope for a brighter future. Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19. They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together.

Being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an act of love. And contributing to ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love. Love is also social and political, there is social love and political love; it is universal, always overflowing with small gestures of personal charity capable of transforming and improving societies (cf. Laudato si', no. 231, cf. Fratelli tutti, 184).

Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable. I pray to God that everyone may contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always great. Contribute with these small gestures for a better future.


