Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
 Recently the news reported that the number of deaths in the US due to coronavirus passed 200,000. It is a sobering number, and there is a lot of suffering that has accompanied the losses. Not only have many died, but many have also been very ill, even if some have hardly felt the effects when infected. And many have experienced the loss of work or have had life events such as weddings or graduations pared back or cancelled. At the same time I have been struck by how differently people respond to the circumstances. Some take great precautions and limit their public engagement. They may be doing that out of concern for their own safety or from concern for others who may be vulnerable. Some do not see the virus in the same light. Some feel that the attention given to the virus and the public actions to mitigate it are disproportionate and may feel imposed upon. However one feels about how authorities should handle the circumstance, the reality of the virus is unchanged, and it retains the capacity to spread easily. The pandemic itself is real and serious and its effects upon the elderly and people with certain accompanying issues are accentuated. A recent reference in church did not reflect the seriousness as I would like, so I want to express that here. The virus is a painful reality. And so we lift up in prayer those who are sick and their loved ones, and we commend to God's mercy those who have died. We also honor and pray for health care workers and others who attend to those who are suffering. Healing the sick was an integral part of Jesus's ministry and thus a part of the mission of his Apostles and his Church. May God mercifully grant us healing of this and many other ills from which we suffer.

The response to the pandemic is therefore dual. On the one hand, it is essential to find a cure for this small but terrible virus, which has brought the whole world to its knees. On the other, we must also cure a larger virus, that of social injustice, inequality of opportunity, marginalisation, and the lack of protection for the weakest. In this dual response for healing there is a choice that, according to the Gospel, cannot be lacking: the preferential option for the poor (see Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii gaudium* [EG], 195). And this is not a political option; nor is it an ideological option, a party option... no. The preferential option for the poor is at the centre of the Gospel. And the first to do this was Jesus; we heard this in the reading from the Letter to the Corinthians which was read at the beginning. Since He was rich, He made Himself poor to enrich us. He made Himself one of us and for this reason, at the centre of
