Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week is National Vocation Awareness Week here in the US with the intention to promote vocations to the priesthood, deaconate, and religious life. It is a call to pray for vocations and to renew support for those who have entered into that life. From the perspective of a local parish priest, I would have to emphasize that such a vocation is one of mystery and service. It is a mystery in that the driving impulse is Jesus and the encounter with him in the Eucharist. His love for us is so overflowing that one can forego the great good of marriage and leading one's own life pursuits for the sake of a life of chaste celibacy and obedience to a superior with some form of simplicity or poverty as well. This is celibacy for the sake of the kingdom. Far more than simply a life choice, one thinks of one's life as an oblation or sacrifice. It is also a gift to the Church. One does not call oneself, but God calls and that is manifest both in the interior movement of the one called and in the human authority such as the bishop or a superior of a community forming a person and eventually accepting the call.

After some years of being a priest and serving the community in a sacramental way, I find it also an experience with the day to day challenges of those who are poor. On the one hand I prepare people for the sacraments and celebrate them with those hungry for Jesus. But in life we also encounter those who are hungry for food or for bills to be paid. In either case, a vocation sets one at the service of others, sometimes in a direct spiritual way and sometimes in an indirect spiritual way through a basic human need. St. Paul points out that Christ became poor although he was rich that we might be rich. A vocation is an embrace of this in one's own life: taking on the poverty, so to speak, of celibacy and obedience to be enriched by Christ and to enrich others with that same love.

Tips for parents for catechesis in the home:

- Pray!

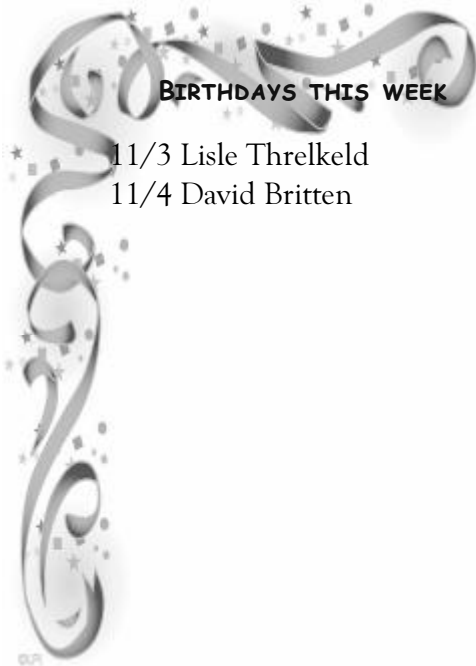

So that we might be able to participate in the healing and regeneration of our peoples, it is only right that everyone should have the adequate resources to do so (cf. *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* [CSDC], 186). After the great economic depression of 1929, Pope Pius XI explained how important the principle of subsidiarity was (cf. Encyclical *Quadragesimo anno*, 79-80). This principle has a double movement: from top to bottom and from bottom to top. Perhaps we do not understand what this means, but it is a social principle that makes us more united. I will try to explain it. On the one hand, and above all in moments of change, when single individuals, families, small associations and local communities are not capable of achieving primary objectives, it is right that the highest levels of society, such as the State, should intervene to provide the resources necessary to progress. For example, because of the coronavirus lockdown, many people, families and economic entities found themselves and still find themselves in serious difficulty. Thus, public institutions are trying to help through appropriate social, economic, health interventions: this is their function, what they need to do. On the other hand, however, society's leaders must respect and promote the intermediate or lower levels. In fact, the contribution of individuals, of families, of associations, of businesses, of every intermediary body, and even of the Church, is decisive. With their own cultural, religious, economic resources, or civil participation, they revitalize and reinforce society (cf. *CSCD*, 185). That is, there is a collaboration from the top to the bottom, from the central State to the people, and from the bottom to the top: from the institutions of people to the top. And this is precisely how the principle of subsidiarity is exercised.


