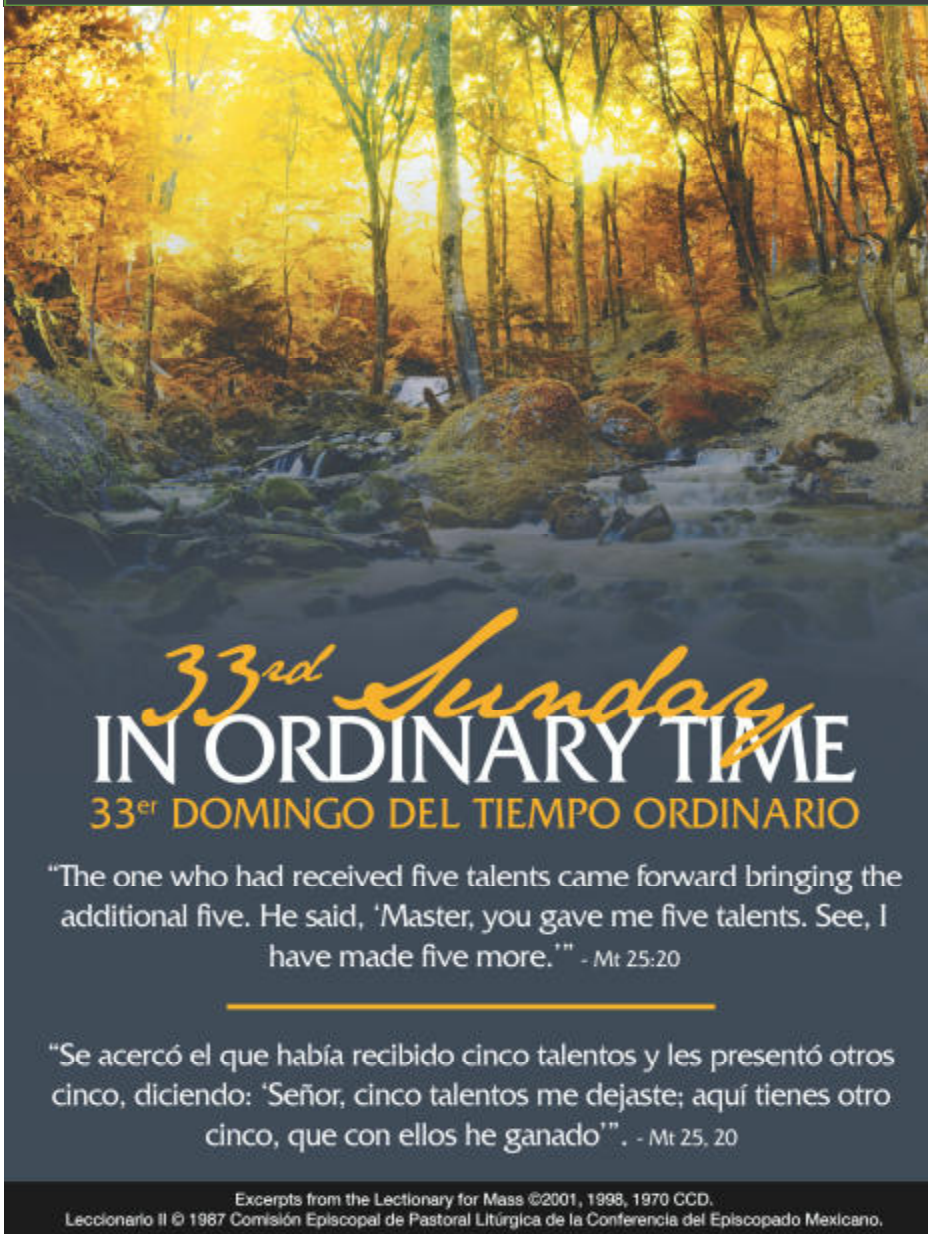

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I would like to offer some reflections on catechesis in the home. In my own experience, I was raised with a public school education and religious education in the home and at Church, much like what we have here. Both of my parents are teachers by training and also served as catechists. In the home we were taught to pray and were taught the basics of the faith. There were materials around like we have in the back of church for continued learning. My parents' own example of staying active in their own faith life was a big help. Attendance at Mass was a given, and sometimes we would also go to daily Mass. All of those things contributed. It was not necessarily formalized in the home, but it was understood as important. In your household, I hope that you are beginning to step into that role of parent and catechist with a bit more ease. Perhaps there are questions of how to use the material or how to begin. Please contact our catechists for practical suggestions. The effort to catechize in and of itself has value, because it communicates the importance. My hope is that this will be an opportunity especially for parents to take hold of that role and responsibility. And I would think that a most important aspect is for the parents' themselves to be learning more profoundly their own faith.

Accompanying the CCF mailing that we are sending out to parents is a sheet that is to be sent back to us. It indicates the safe environment training that the parents offer to their children. PLEASE return that. It is important for all of us that we continue this safe environment program even under our present circumstances of catechesis in the home. Thank you for your effort in this!

Religious Education

Tips for parents for catechesis in the home:

- Pray!
- Just do it! And be consistent especially with the time given.
- Include devotions: Rosary; Angelus; Act Contrition; Scripture reading together; Readings for the day are helpful as found in *The Word Among Us*.
- Include Saints in the lessons. (Saints books are helpful, and the Saint of the day.)
- Read the lesson ahead of time.
- Set a time each week.
- Don't be afraid to say "I do not know, but I can find out. I will write it down and ask Father Ken later."
- Older kids can assist younger kids.

From Pope Francis, General Audience, Wednesday, October 7 2020, a catechesis on prayer with a focus on Elijah this week.

The pages of the Bible suggest that Elijah's faith also made progress: he too grew in prayer, he refined it little by little. God's face came into focus for him as he walked. He reached his peak in that extraordinary experience, when God manifested himself to Elijah on the mount (cf. 1 Kings 19:9-13). He manifested himself not in the fierce storm, not in the earthquake or the devouring fire, but in "a still small voice" (v. 12). Or better, a translation that reflects that experience well: in a thread of resounding silence. This is how God manifests himself to Elijah. It is with this humble sign that God communicates with Elijah, who at that moment was a fugitive prophet who had lost peace. God comes forward to meet a tired man, a man who thought he had failed on all fronts, and with that gentle breeze, with that thread of resounding silence, He brings calm and peace back into his heart. This is the story of Elijah, but it seems written for all of us. Some evenings we may feel useless and alone. It is then that prayer will come and knock on the door of our hearts. We can all gather a corner of Elijah's cloak, just as his disciple Elisha collected half his cloak. And even if we have done something wrong, or if we feel threatened and frightened, when we return before God with prayer, serenity and peace will return as if by miracle. This is what the example of Elijah teaches us.


