

'Our Lives Should Speak as Witnesses of the Gospel'


On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing His mission on earth. But we also can view this Feast as a celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples.

Today's Gospel draws our attention to the clear instructions that Jesus gave His disciples (and to us) just before ascending to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Embracing a stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the use of time, talent and treasure, helps us to live in such a way that our very lives speak as a witness of the Good News of the Gospel. Missionary Discipleship Corner

On Memorial Day, we celebrate the many heroes that have served our country and defended our freedom. One such hero is Father Emil Kapaun, a Catholic Priest that served as a Chaplain for the 8th Cavalry Regiment of the 1st Cavalry Division of the U.S. Army. Father Kapaun's unit was sent to Korea in 1950, where he bravely served our Lord, our nation, and his fellow soldiers. I first learned of Father Kapaun from one of the Formed.org features, The Story of Father Kapaun. He was born near the small rural community of Pilsen, Kansas. When he was ordained a priest, he begin his ministry at his local church of St. John Nepomucene in Pilsen. During World War II, in addition to his parish duties, Father Kapaun would hold Mass for the soldiers at nearby Fort Herington airbase. This ministry inspired him to enlist in the U.S. Army Chaplain Corps in 1944. He first served as a Chaplain in World War II in India. When the war broke out in Korea, he was on the front lines and he was ultimately captured along with other soldiers, and sent to a POW camp in Pyoktong.

As we gratefully remember the women and men that served our nation, I invite you to do a bit of research about Father Emil Kapaun. In addition to the Formed.org video I mentioned above, there is a website devoted to his Cause for Beatification and Canonization, frkapaun.org. I truly enjoyed getting to know the incredible story Father Kapaun through this study.

God's Game of Telephone

You've probably played the game of "pass it on" before, maybe years ago on the playground. It's a simple concept: one person whispers something in another person's ear, and it gets repeated person by person throughout the group, until finally the last one to hear the message has to say it out loud. Whatever ends up being said at the end of the game is usually a far cry from the original statement, and everyone has a good laugh.

As individuals, we don't receive news in the same way. Our personalities, our histories, our weaknesses, and our strengths determine how we interact with information we encounter in the world, both good and bad. One person will interpret a compliment positively; someone else will take offense. One person reacts to news of a job promotion with joy, another is disappointed that now they will have less time with their family. The same news can mean completely different things to different people.

But what God gives us is the truth in love, and the truth in love is the same in every place and in every time, for every person of every race. When Christ prayed to the Father that "the love with which you loved me may be in them," he was asking that the magnificent gift that had been imparted to him would also be imparted to us.

Our job is to play a game of pass it on with this gift of love. How do we keep it from becoming warped? Through remaining committed to the word of God, to the sacraments, and to one another.

In this game, we don't change the message. The message changes us. And we have to give it away to keep it.


