'The Holy Spirit Empowers Us to Share the Good News'

Today we reach the finale of the Easter season with the celebration of the great Feast of Pentecost. Reflecting on today's readings inspires a sense of awe as we consider the mighty power of the Holy Spirit at work giving birth to and sustaining our Church. Just as awesome — the same Spirit is calling to us this day to take up our part in the Church's saving work.

In the first reading, from Acts, we see the creative genius of the Holy Spirit moving through the newly confirmed Apostles "who began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The large crowd, gathered from all over the world were "amazed" and "astounded" that each one could understand the Apostles speaking in their own language.

Each one of us, young and old alike, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our "own language" to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our own language as the particular gifts, talents, and passions we possess. We experience the presence of the Holy Spirit through them, and we are meant to put them to the work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God.

When we consider the stewardship way of life we are called to live, we often focus on the challenges it poses. Surrendering ourselves to God is indeed a challenging way to live. But it leads to a life that is exciting, creative, and deeply rewarding. Stewardship allows us to experience

life as a great adventure because it is a life guided and directed by the very source of power and creativity — the Holy Spirit!

Missionary Discipleship Corner

This week, Father Lukee's reflection is focused on the Holy Spirit and the birth of our Church. In my travels, when I meet new people, the conversation will inevitably lead to the question, "what do you do for a living" or something like that. When I respond that I work for three Catholic churches, sometimes I will end up in a discussion that reveals the other person is spiritual but not religious. It is an interesting concept that I have pondered myself at different places along my journey.

I recently listened to the Formed.org feature entitled "Religionless Spirituality" hosted by Dr. Tim Gray. If you have a chance to download the Formed.org app and listen to this program during a ride in the car, I do believe you will enjoy it. Dr. Gray speaks about the idea of somebody preferring a relationship with Christ rather than a being part of religion to be fulfilled, and the idea of bypassing doctrine (church teachings) in favor of focusing one's efforts to promote getting along as human beings. He goes onto explore the idea that Christ lived to build the Kingdom of God.

When Kym Allex was our Missionary Discipleship Coordinator, she and I would often talk about "the <u>and</u> rather than the <u>or</u>" when we would encounter different opportunities or challenges. In this case, the idea might be to focus on relationship with Christ and community (church participation) rather than just one or the other. The connection between the Dr. Tim Gray program and Father Lukee's reflection is a direct one. In addition, this leads right to our Three Catholic Churches Mission – "to lead, through love, our entire community to the Kingdom of God." In short, we are continuing the work that Christ began – building the church, building kingdom of God, and thereby fulfilling the second portion of the Great Commandment, to love our neighbor.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Do You Speak Stewardship?

If you are married, I'm guessing that you know the best way to break bad news to your spouse, whether you realize it or not. Maybe it's simply that you know not to talk about the budget after your wife's football team has lost. Maybe you know your husband will take the news that your sister is coming to stay a little easier if you tell him over his favorite dinner. We do the same thing with our children, our friends, our coworkers — we have all learned the language of the people we love.

The truth is the same in every language, but it's important for us to convey that truth graciously. That's what Pentecost teaches us. The gift of being able to speak in tongues afforded the Apostles a practical skill to spread the Gospel message, but it also served as a powerful symbol of the importance of effective communication. Evangelization can only happen when you're speaking in words a person is able, ready, and willing to hear.

Let's ask ourselves: what is the language we need to speak to share the truth with the person who is standing in front of us? Is it the language of quality time? The language of concern? The language of laughter and friendship? The language of authenticity, of plain talk and frankness?

The Holy Spirit gave the Apostles the ability to speak in tongues, and it seems miraculous when we read about it in the Gospels — but only consider that we all have this same ability, in a certain way. The Holy Spirit can and will show us how to speak the truth, if we only ask.


