'Give Them Some Food Yourselves'

What Jesus intends to be a quiet time between Him, and the disciples is disrupted by the crowds that trail them behind to Bethsaida. They follow Him, bringing along their sick relatives. Jesus adjusts His plans and welcomes to their circle people who are in need.

The twelve do not imbibe Jesus' goodwill and generosity for the people. They suggest that Jesus send the crowd away; they do not want to get involved any further. By their reckoning, they have already done enough.


Having healed the sick the whole day, Jesus has compassion for the people and asks the twelve to give them something to eat. The Apostles find the situation impossible. But Jesus takes their very meager resources (five loaves and two fish), looks up to heaven, blesses and breaks them, and gives them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all eat and are satisfied, with 12 baskets of leftovers gathered.

Jesus will repeat His action at the Last Supper, and these will be the basis for the Eucharist. Jesus emphasizes that sacrificial self-giving is more important than the quantity or material value of our offerings. God's miracles happen only when we are involved. Whatever small blessing we possess can be an instrument of God's miracle if put in the hands of Jesus.

People often say that they do not have much to offer since they are poor. What Jesus does is meant to banish such illusion. For Him, each one of us is important, and if Jesus were to make present-day miracles, He would always involve the contribution of everyone.

The natives in the Philippines (Aetas) live by a wonderful adage: *"I have a* half pound of rice; enough for so many, but not enough for one person." How true indeed is the saying that *'there is always enough* for everybody's need but never enough for everyone's greed'.


