'Have You Really Decided to Follow Jesus?'

"He resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem." Jesus lived a life of complete and total obedience to the heavenly Father. He knew that he would be apprehended, tortured and killed in Jerusalem. But he also knew it is the will of the Father. So, nobody can take his eyes off Jerusalem. His face was set on that direction. How about us? How focused are we in going to heaven? Most of the times, our focus is in getting more material things, or in being successful in our career. But we rarely show similar determination to be close to Jesus or to attain eternal life in heaven.

Following Jesus involves three things: **first**, it demands that we transfer our sense of security from earthly things to the Lord. Following Jesus means that we have to trust him instead of putting our trust in our money and in human powers and worldly resources. This is an invitation to shift our focus from the material to the spiritual, from the visible to the invisible, from man to God. **Second**, following Jesus means persevering through difficulties. It is never easy. It always entails hard work, sacrifices and trials. But he said, "He who perseveres till the end will reap the reward of everlasting life." **Third**, following Jesus needs a firm and resolute decision on our part without conditions and vacillations. We are not in a position to set conditions in following Jesus. He is the Lord, and He is the one who sets the conditions. Our task is just to follow Him without questions, conditions and hesitations.

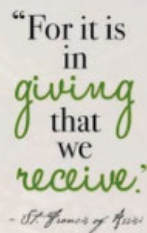

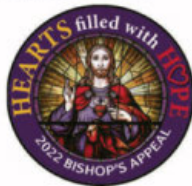

Missionary Discipleship Corner

Have you ever been asked the question, “what is your ideal?” In other words, what motivates you? Taken further, what is your top goal when you look ahead to your future? This week, Father Lukee’s reflection talks about following Jesus as we strive to reach heaven – that sounds like a pretty awesome ideal to me! Father Mike Schmitz has a talk called “The Four Last Things”, available on Formed.org. Many people have watched Father Mike on YouTube videos and/or have been part of his Bible In A Year podcast series. This feature dives into the “big four” topics of death, judgement, heaven and hell. Vicar General and Chancellor

Question:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.
