

4th SUNDAY OF LENT

Today's Gospel parable, universally known as the parable of the Prodigal Son, is also called the parable of the Lost Son, to align it with the lost sheep and the lost coin. A close reading of the parable will suggest, however. that it is not only the younger son who was lost but the older one as well.

Let us reflect on why the older son likewise is lost. He enters the scene in the second half of the parable as he journeys back home from the field. He hears music and dancing and upon inquiry is told that his younger brother has returned and that their father has given him a big celebration in welcome. The elder son became angry: whereas the father welcomes the younger son with compassion. The elder son responded by preventing the younger son from entering the house to welcome the guests of his father as obligation of courtesy. Thus, he insults his father publicly (there are people around who see him "snubbing" his father). His action clearly violates the fifth commandment which commands a person to honor his/her parents.

When the father comes out of the house and pleads with him, he already exposes himself to public humiliation (a son is supposed to be at the beck of his father's call). Still, the son makes a series of action that further hurts the old man's feelings. He begins his reply by omitting the title "Father" and enumerates his father's failures. He says that he has been working like a slave for his father, yet he had not been given even a kid goat, implying that he regards his father as an employer or master, not as a loving and generous parent. He expects a reward precisely on the basis of his work as a slave, on the basis of his own steadfast service in not transgressing his father's command. It does not enter his mind that his actions so far are clear insults to his farther and transgressions against his honor.

In all these vicissitudes, the father remains true to himself as a loving and compassionate parent. He assures the elder son that he has not been shortchanged in comparison with his brother, and that a slave category is inappropriate for their relationship. He is always a son, and moreover, as the elder one, is the heir. All that belongs to his father is his. How can the father give him more?

The parable then ends with the father's pleading for the elder son to enter the house and join the celebration. There is no indication of the elder son's response. The younger son has already come home. Will the older brother "come in" and share the joy of the father and his whole household?

Jesus' words remain in the Gospel as a pleading invitation for all of us who feel "shortchanged" in any way.
