

LIKE PETER, WE ARE WORKS IN PROGRESS!

"Work in progress. Sorry for the inconvenience." This sign over some unfinished work in the street is an appropriate description of every human being's journey to conversion. There is so much work that goes on, and we beg patience from people and from God for the inconvenience.

Peter is one New Testament character who inspires us with his story of conversion. His character dominates today's Gospel. He is the fisherman bringing in the net, the shepherd of the Lord's flock, the disciple who will suffer and die. His threefold confession of love is meant to counteract his earlier threefold denial. After the Resurrection and Pentecost events. Peter, who had denied Jesus, has become an empowered disciple who courageously testifies to Jesus together with the other apostles.

There is something in Peter that many of us can identify with. During Jesus' public ministry, Peter confessed of Jesus, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16:16). At the end of Jesus' self-revelation as the Bread of Life, he boldly declared his willingness to stick to Jesus even as the other disciples walked away and left Jesus' company: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (Jn 6:68). During the Last Supper, after Jesus had informed them about their future scattering to save themselves, Peter zealously announced, "Though all may have their faith in you shaken, mine will never be" (Mt 26:33). But Jesus' prediction came true: Peter denied Jesus three times.

Peter was an impulsive, transparent man. His love for Jesus was genuine, yet he was unable to gather himself in the face of danger. Here, he remembers well his betrayal, and it pains him to the heart. When interrogated by Jesus about the authenticity of his love, Peter is distressed and can only declare, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you" (v 17).

Peter's journey of discipleship reflects a human being's fragility outside the loving compassion of Jesus. Jesus is not surprised by human weakness. He sees his disciples as "**works in progress**." Jesus rehabilitates Peter to make him greater than what he believed he could be. Such love and trust can come only from Jesus. He does not dwell on Peter's weaknesses but empowers him to be the great person that he intends him to be.
