## THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR



### MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN

This weekend, August 7-8, 2021, throughout the Archdiocese, we observe the Missionary Cooperation Plan, the annual collection that connects our archdiocese with missionary causes around the world. Unfortunately, for a second summer the missionaries could not send speakers to visit us in person due to the global pandemic. Religious congregations of sisters, brothers and priests, along with missionary dioceses and organizations such as schools, orphanages and medical clinics benefit from our prayers and donations. We will have a second collection for the missions at the Masses today.

### ST. CLARE OF ASSISI



Wednesday, August 11 is for Franciscans throughout the world a special day to celebrate the feast of St. Clare of Assisi. Clare was born in 1193 into a family of the nobility of Assisi, Italy. As a young girl she showed great compassion for the poor and devotion to prayer. Hearing Francis of Assisi and his followers preach she felt the call to follow their way of life in living the Gospel. Though facing great opposition by her father and brothers Clare secretly went to the small church of Our Lady of Angels on Palm Sunday in 1212 and was received into religious life by Francis.

At the time of Clare all religious nuns lived behind cloistered walls. Initially Clare and her followers lived with the Benedictine sisters but eventually were able to move to the church of San Damiano in Assisi where a convent was established for the sisters. Because the culture of the Middle Ages and Church regulations would not allow women religious outside the cloister, Clare and “*the Poor Ladies*” as they were called devoted themselves to a life of prayer and sacrifice.


All her life Clare fought (even the Pope!) for “*the privilege of poverty*.” It was only on her deathbed that Pope Innocent IV relented and signed the papal document giving that privilege to Clare and all the “*Poor Clares*” who would follow after her. Clare was canonized in 1255, two years after her death.

As the premier Franciscan saint, after Francis of Assisi, we honor St. Clare as a woman who fought to live the Gospel as faithfully as she saw Francis and his followers trying to follow Christ. I pray each one of us who worship here at St. Anthony’s may have such passion and grace from God to follow the Gospel as

Christ leads us. Let us keep our Poor Clare sisters throughout the world in our prayers today as they celebrate “*Our Holy Mother Clare*.”

To learn more about St. Clare, I encourage you to attend a special talk by Fr. Robert Hutmacher, OFM on “**Clare - A Woman of Great Strength**”. This presentation will be held in the St. Clare Auditorium on Thursday, August 12 at 12:15 pm.

### ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



Next weekend, August 14-15 we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On November 1, 1950 Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of our faith. In his declaration he said, “*We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory.*” The Church has held belief in the Assumption as far back as the fifth century. In the midst of our summer activities and vacation we pause this weekend to recall the important role Mary has played in salvation history. Pope emeritus Benedict XVI reflected a few years ago that, “*...precisely because Mary is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us. While she lived on this earth she could only be close to a few people. Being in God, who is actually ‘within’ all of us, Mary shares in this closeness to God.*”

### HEALTH

As we are aware the COVID pandemic has greatly impacted our church, city and the entire world. As more people were vaccinated it appeared that the danger of this virus would continue to lessen here in the USA. In fact, mask mandates, registering for Masses, and many other restrictions were lessened as the readily available vaccines were helping stop the spread of this terrible disease.

While some people have been unable to receive the vaccine due to various health concerns for themselves many people are able to be vaccinated. Unfortunately, a rapidly growing variant of COVID is now causing another increase in those affected with this new variant of the disease. Hospitals throughout the country are noticing an alarming increase in those who have this new variant. As medical, scientific and health workers are reporting, most of those now getting COVID are those who have not received any vaccine against this disease.

While I cannot force anyone to receive any of the available vaccines against this disease, I ask those of you who have so far refused to receive the vaccine to reconsider your decision. Overwhelming scientific evidence is that because so many are not being vaccinated this variant is growing rapidly putting at risk many people and filling up our hospitals again with those suffering from COVID.

All of the friars here at St. Peter's have been vaccinated for many months now. As soon as we were able, we received this vaccine so that we would not put our elderly friars at risk in the friary as well as to be sure we would not put any of you who come to St. Peter's at risk. Pope Francis has spoken often that to receive the vaccine to help stop the spread of COVID is truly a Christian act of being concerned for one another. Pope Francis has stated, *"I believe that morally everyone must take the vaccine. It is the moral choice because it is about your life but also the lives of others."* As disciples of Jesus, who preached and lived kindness for our brothers and sisters, we can do no less.

I am at a loss as to why so many have politicized this life-saving vaccine in our country. As the danger of this variant of COVID increases I am concerned that we may have to return to mandated wearing of masks, limiting gatherings of people and other restrictions to help stop the spread of a disease that the medical community tells us could be halted if the majority of people were vaccinated.


As of the writing of this bulletin (8/1/21) the City of Chicago Health Department and the Archdiocese of Chicago have issued Guidelines that strongly recommends that everyone, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask in indoor public places. If the wearing of masks for Masses and other church events at St. Peter's becomes mandatory we will keep you informed. The resurgence of the COVID delta variant presents us with further dangers to the health of everyone, especially our mostly vulnerable people. May we all do everything we can to help prevent the further spread of this deadly disease. As we move forward through the summer I encourage you to help everyone around us stay healthy. May God's Spirit help us all in these difficult times.

### SECURITY

As I mentioned in last weekend's bulletin, after 33 years of faithful service to St. Peter's Church, the director of our St. Peter's Church Security Team has retired. Gilbert Matthews was instrumental in helping establish our security team and has served as director from the beginning. Providing directions, helping those who might have fallen ill or injured at the church or helping direct troubled people from the church, Gilbert

helped assure all of us a place to worship in safety and security over these past 33 years. Mr. Mychael Ramos, who has been working security here at St. Peter's for a number of years, has been appointed the Director of Security for St. Peter's. Please keep our security team and all those throughout the City who keep us safe in your prayers. I thank our security team here at St. Peter's for their dedication and faithfulness to helping keep the church as a place of peace and prayer.

## THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE STUDY

*Jn. 6:41-51; Eph. 4:30 – 5:2*

As not only our children but many American adults as well tend increasingly toward obesity these words, whether spoken by medical experts recommending a more balanced diet or by nutritionists pointing out the value of healthier school lunch choices, seem to be directed right at us: "You are what you eat."



"I am the living bread...". As Covid restrictions in many areas are gradually relaxing people are coming back to church and again coming forward to receive Communion. Row after row, it seems that almost everyone "goes to Communion" on Sunday. But does what we eat on Sunday make any difference on Monday?

Overheard at the coffee machine: "Fred was let go last week." "What happened?" "Don't know, but it must have been pretty bad. He's got a wife and a couple of kids, you know. Wonder if he got any kind of severance package." Does anybody *call* Fred? Or are they too busy going through his desk to see what kind of stuff he left behind? For that matter, what kind of stuff *did* Fred leave behind? Notes? Files? Or was Fred so angry that he either took everything with him or destroyed it? What really happened? Was Fred "let go"? Or did he *quit*? Is it possible that somebody's trying to twist the story of Fred's leaving in order to make either Fred or the company look bad?

"All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice." Paul was talking to the Ephesians but sometimes it seems that his words could just as easily be directed at us – especially during rush hour (or even on our way out of the parking lot after Mass!).

"[B]e kind...compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you...". This "becoming what we eat" is harder than it looks! Couldn't we just concentrate on *eating* and forget that *becoming* part? "[T]he bread that I...give is my flesh for the life of the world." Now *Jesus'* words are directed at us. "You are what you eat". What *do* we eat on Sunday? And does it make any difference on Monday?








**Spiritual Direction** is a way of listening for God's wisdom and understanding in our daily life by talking about our relationship with God and others.
