

MARRIAGE MOMENTS & PARENTING POINTERS



FOR THE FAMILY

Reflecting on the Word: This is the last Sunday of the liturgical year. We began the year last Advent by anticipating the birth of Jesus, our King. Today, at the end of the year, we celebrate Jesus as King of the Universe. Jesus admits that he is truly a king but one that Pontius Pilate does not understand. Take some time to reflect on the kingdom that Jesus announces and consider how you would describe the kind of king Jesus is.

On the Way Home from Mass: Recall your discussion about kings and kingdoms. How does Jesus compare to the world's image of a king?

Living the Word: What does God expect of those who build his kingdom? Jesus says that everyone who belongs to the truth listens to his voice. How do we listen to his voice? How do we show that we belong to the truth? How do people in Jesus' kingdom speak to one another? How do they act toward one another? Then, as a family, decide how you will put this into practice.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

We often come to life expecting all of the pieces of the puzzle to nicely fit together. We want and expect harmony, order, and fairness, the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good health, and happiness. We can more easily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life, but have a real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. Willing to put in a good measure of effort, we desire positive results. When things go wrong and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprising creative! He turns the tables on not only our understanding of life, but of what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but a king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in faith! There may be hardship and disappointment now but there are more surprises to come.

Once we understand this truth, we will also understand that we are on a most incredible and awesome universal journey to Christ and becoming one in Christ. We all carry within us the image of God, the image of our suffering king. The One who lives in us also lives in all of our brothers and sisters. Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king, as well. There are many things that can bring hardship to life. If we keep our head about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the greatest degree of justice possible. Even though there are ample things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our deepest joy comes from union with God and our brothers and sisters. One day, the fullness of that joy will be ours to have when we are all eternally one with Christ our King forever.

FEATURED ARTICLE

It is difficult to put into words a program that I feel so very passionate about without writing pages and pages. Blessings in a Backpack is the first year-long outreach program Holy Spirit has committed to as a combined parish and school effort. We are from diverse backgrounds and homes but it is a fair statement to say the majority of our members have not ever been “food-insecure”. It has been a humbling and eye-opening experience for those of us who have taken the time to volunteer and/or read about the Blessings in a Backpack program. Even the younger children who have helped pack bags have commented on how sad it is that some children who qualify for the program may ONLY have what we pack for their weekend food. YET, they are also so proud to help. It has been a gift to be able to spend time (30 minutes every other Sunday) together in an effort that brings home the stark reality of hunger and appreciation for the gifts we have and possibly take for granted.

Qualifying children come from various situations. Many do not have a microwave, working stove or refrigerator, or even a simple can opener. They may be in homes where they are not always supervised by an adult. It is important that any food packed is child friendly, i.e. easy to open, heating/cooking not necessary and always non-perishable.

Please read the information below taken from Blessings in a Backpack literature:

Blessings in a Backpack started with just two schools in 2005 and now serves 88,900 students in 1,092 schools spread throughout 46 states and the District of Columbia.

Blessings in a Backpack Impact:

Blessings in a Backpack has partnered with Quaker Oats and Ipsos, a leading global market research company, on a national evaluation project that measures program impact on a deeper level than bags and pounds of food distributed. This project involved various Blessings’ stakeholders, such as children and teachers, in the evaluation process. Surveys found that, in addition to no longer feeling weekend hunger pangs, children fed by Blessings experience the following impact on their lives:

- 78% of kids feel cared for by their community.
- 71% of kids feel that Blessings is helping their family.
- 60% of kids have fewer behavioral issues.
- 60% of children report that their school attendance is better.
- 59% find it is easier to learn at school

The Facts About Hunger:

What does it mean to be food-insecure?

A food-insecure household has limited or uncertain access to enough food to support a healthy life.

Childhood Hunger in the United States

Children are more likely to face food insecurity than any other group in the United States. Due to a significant rise in unemployment in 2020, and a corresponding increase in child poverty, it’s projected that 18 million children (one in four) may be struggling with food insecurity. [Click here to read an analysis from Feeding America](#) that projects what hunger and food insecurity will look like for kids in the coming months.

- **Before COVID-19**
Three out of four teachers say they have children in their classrooms who regularly come to school hungry. +
- Three prevalent consequences of hunger in schools: inability to concentrate, poor academic performance, and headaches, and stomach aches. +
- Nearly half (44%) of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP or food stamps) are kids. **

Blessings in a Backpack continued.....

Criteria for Selecting the Food You Pack: We consider many factors: nutritional value, appropriateness for the children we feed, long-term availability, cost, ease of opening, portion size, shelf life, and variety. Our menu items are evaluated by a registered dietitian committed to providing healthy options that are low in sodium and sugar, made with whole grains, and are good protein sources. Since many of the children we serve may not have access to conveniences like working appliances or a can opener, our menus must contain ready-to-eat foods. Our foods also do not require refrigeration, require little to no preparation, and are peanut-free.

DONATE

For \$130 you can help us feed a child every weekend of the school year.

I am proud to be a part of the Holy Spirit community and of the difference we have already made.

All qualifying students at Dunn Elementary have been guaranteed a weekend bag of food for this school year and NEXT school year through Holy Spirit's generosity in monetary donations.

An elementary school in Hazard, Kentucky has gone without a Blessings in a Backpack program for several years because the generous donor who was supporting it is no longer involved. Holy Spirit has taken on the challenge to start the program back up for this school where a majority of students qualify, but the community does not have the financial means to support the program.
