1Sm 3:3-10,19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Reflection Questions for the Readings for January 17, 2021

In the first reading, Samuel hears God's voice calling to him as he sleeps. How do you experience the voice of God calling to you?

The psalm response for today echoes Samuel's answer to the voice calling to him in the night, "Here I am." How do you practice being present to God and to those who share your life?

St. Paul writes to the Corinthians, "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you?" How would you answer Paul's question?

In today's gospel Jesus is identified as the Lamb of God, as Teacher, and as Messiah. What do these titles tell you about Jesus's identity?



Reflection

In a December 8, 2020 apostolic letter, *“Patris Corde”* (“With a father’s heart”), the pope said Christians can discover in St. Joseph, who often goes unnoticed, “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble.”

“St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others. They understood that no one is saved alone. . . Each of us can discover in Joseph-the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence-an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble.

Marking the 150th Anniversary of St. Joseph being declared patron of the universal church, Pope Francis proclaimed a yearlong celebration dedicated to the foster father of Jesus.

Discipleship

How many people daily exercise patience and offer hope, taking care to spread not panic, but shared responsibility. How many fathers, mothers, grandparents and teachers are showing our children, in small everyday ways, how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines, looking ahead and encouraging the practice of prayer. How many are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all.

I saw God

A couple of weeks ago the parish staff gathered at Salvation Army on a Saturday morning to cook and serve their drive through lunch program. They had been shut down for a week due to the holidays so they were not sure on how many to count on showing up. It could be anywhere from 300 to 100 or less. It happened to be on the lower end. Not discouraged by the lower turnout Beth Probus our youth minister go on the phone. She called people that she had worked with in the summer feeding program. They identified several families who could use help and where to find them. Beth and John Probus loaded up their vehicle and took off to deliver meals to families in need. Beth knew where to go because she knows the community and its needs. Beth’s joy when she returned having helped out many families was a moment to glimpse the presence of God.

Nutrition is a health area that can be hard to make good choices. We have many GREAT cooks here on this Earth, and we love to enjoy the labors of their talents! I believe the Lord helps us be good cooks but we have to learn moderation! Let's review our dietary habits. Do we eat the wrong foods, too much food, or both? Don't be too hard on yourself! Christ Is Anything but Ordinary

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ... ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flatlining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory.

Are you bored yet?

Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call.

In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question.

What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see." Andrew was looking for the Messiah — the One who makes even Ordinary Time extraordinary. The One who can sanctify the longest and dullest of to-do lists, on the longest and dullest of days. The One whose peace can reign in our homes on January 25, not just December 25.

Remember what you are looking for. Come, and you will see.

From the Diocese of Owensboro:

- Neither the Governor nor the CDC has relaxed their directives or recommendations regarding gatherings outside of the Liturgy. The coronavirus is still with us and the transmission and death rates are now at an all-time high. The virus contributed to 350,000 deaths and the projections put us over 400,000 by the end of the month. The entire world continues to try and slow down transmissions until there are enough inoculations to create herd immunity.

NON-ESSENTIAL PARISH MEETINGS

Please eliminate non-essential meetings where possible. We continue to ask for your patience and to eliminate all non-essential meetings that cannot be held in the ZOOM environment.
