

Reading 1 Jon 3:1-5,10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah, saying: "Set out for the great city of Nineveh, and announce to it the message that I will tell you." So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh, according to the LORD'S bidding. Now Nineveh was an enormously large city; it took three days to go through it. Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed," when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out.



"Repent, and believe in the gospel." Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrong doing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God's grace we now see the light.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection

This weekend the readings are quite inspiring. Jonah is called by God to go to Nineveh with his message for the people to repent. When the people of Nineveh hear Jonah they believe and everyone from king to beggar dress in sack cloth and ashes. In the Gospel Jesus calls and the disciples follow. They drop their nets, their way of life and they go and follow Jesus.

The power of God to work such wonders in the hearts of those who hear his word is wonderful and amazing. It can also seem off putting because I am not for sure I could do that.

As Paul Harvey, the famous radio personality, would say, "Let us look at the rest of the story." The call to Jonah is not the first call, the first time to escape the call he hops in a boat, gets dumped off the boat, ends up in the belly of a whale, gets thrown up on the shore, and then he is ready to go to Nineveh.

And we all know that Jesus spent three years with his disciples, teaching and working miracles and still Peter denies him before the crucifixion.

The power of the Word of God is awe inspiring. It has the power of change lives. But it is received by human fragile instruments who often fail. Jesus never sent the disciples away and worked with another group. God did not give up on Jonah just helped to motivate him. God does not give up on us either. He calls us to come and follow, to be his disciples. There are days when the love of God flows from us and others we seem as dark as the night. But God always believes in us, forgives us and sends us out again.

Discipleship

Has the word of God ever touched your heart as it did the disciples? Has it inspired you to dedicate your life to God? I hope so, in one way or another. There is no other feeling like it. If not, it can be as easy as asking. Quiet yourself open your heart to God and invite him in. Don't be discouraged if it does not happen right away, keep trying. And don't worry that you will become holier than thou, you will still lose patience with your children and spouse. But the relationship you develop with Jesus Christ will give you hope when things seem dark and patience when all else fails.

I saw God

As you probably know the priest are quarantined as Fr. Gary recovers from the coronavirus. Please keep him in your prayers. This is definitely not the way I would have chosen to spend the week. As always the generosity of the parish and the staff has been over-whelming. Food has been brought in and errands have been run. I write this on Monday night with 6 more days to go. Today a priest texted me to see if we needed anything and offering his prayers for Fr. Gary. He also offered to help with masses this weekend. Fr. Carmelo from St. Michael's in Sebree will be with us next weekend for masses. I had the opportunity to travel to Sebree a couple of weeks ago when the priests at St. Michael's were quarantined.

With all the news of conflict, hatred and division that we are hearing it is always heartwarming to see that most people are basically good. They care for their neighbors. Granted there is a great deal of healing that our country needs. I encourage you to get involved in helping to support local changes. Prayer for a powerful healing to come upon our nation. Show respect to one another and help out those in need.

How did your Goal writing go last week?

Did you notice your self—having a colorful plate? Do not give up keep trying to make healthy choices.

Let's look at a Healthy Habit of Exercise! If you are over the age of 40, PLEASE have clearance from your health care provider to exercise. There are many different types of exercise to choose from. Start simple and gain your confidence!

Below are a few EXAMPLES

#1. What is an activity of exercise I can include as a Healthy Habit?

I would like to improve my activity level and begin simple exercise.

#2. How will I do this?

Look at calendar each week and choose 3 days to exercise. Begin with 10 minutes first week.

#3. When will I work on this plan?

Goal to do exercise 10 minutes each day for 3 days a week, increase 5 minutes each day until reach 30 minutes of time to exercise.

After 3 weeks I can commit to 30 minutes 3 times a week as a healthy lifestyle habit.

#4. What have I done well?

I am able to plan 3 days a week and have created habit to commit to exercise.

#5. What can I improve upon?

Plan for an accountability partner and make adjustments to plan of exercise when schedules change.

REFLECT the journey of healthy improvement and focus to begin 2021.

WEEK 1. Start with the Spiritual Health, then more health goals to come!

WEEK 2. Nutritional improvements with healthy fruits and vegetables!

WEEK 3. Exercise to have a routine of Healthy Lifestyle!

Give Until It Hurts

One of the characteristics of Everyday Stewardship is to be committed — to persevere daily in a way of life acknowledging that everything belongs to God. I know, I know. Easier said than done.

Just ask Zebedee. It's quite an image we get from the Gospel, after all. "So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him."

There was Zebedee, about his business, mending nets with his two sons, who were undoubtedly his best workers — they had to have been more dedicated than the hired men, who worked for wages rather than for family. And in an instant off they go, following this strange man.

I don't know about you, but if my kids left me on a hot summer day to finish the lawn by myself, I wouldn't be too happy.

But Zebedee must have been someone quite special. Perhaps he realized that his sons didn't belong to him — not really. They belonged to God, and from the beginning of time, it had been appointed that they would be among the first disciples of Christ. He passed, he called, they followed, and Zebedee obliged. He simply went back to mending his nets, I imagine.

Zebedee already understood what St. Teresa of Calcutta would say millennia later: "Give until it hurts."

"You're wasting my time." "I've done so much for her; she owes me this." How often do we think things, and even people and relationships, belong to us? The truth is none of them do. We must be ready, as Zebedee was, to surrender them to God when He comes walking past.
