

## Sunday Readings for February 14, 2021

### Reading 1 Lv 13:1-2,44-46

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "If someone has on his skin a scab or pustule or blotch which appears to be the sore of leprosy, he shall be brought to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests among his descendants. If the man is leprous and unclean, the priest shall declare him unclean by reason of the sore on his head. "The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!' As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.



### Reflection Questions for the Readings for February 14, 2021

In the first reading from Leviticus we hear of people with leprosy being ostracized from the community due to fear over their disease. Which groups in your community fear ostracism and isolation due to fear?

The responsorial psalm lifts up the joy to be found in the Lord, even in the midst of trouble. Where do you experience the most joy in your life at this moment?

St. Paul urges the Corinthians to "do everything for the glory of God." How does your parish community live out this command?

We hear that Jesus is "moved with pity" at the plight of the leper and reaches out to touch him, breaking the law of the time. How as Christians shall we respond when laws, rules, or regulations stand in the way of compassion?

# STATE OF THE UNION

## Pastor's Report

**Front Entrance:** The front entrance has been completed. Many thanks to AVP Construction for the fine job that they did and the ease of working with them. I believe that the additions to the front blend in well with the historic church and at the same time are very functional. I know there have been some questions concerning the metal rail that was installed with the project. The metal rail was installed due to code regulations. Thanks to money received from the sale of crops on the Alles Farms and interest from investments from the Alles Estate we were able to pay for this project without turning the parish for direct contributions.

**Covid Reminder:** Due to Covid requirements and the need to keep a close count on the number of people in church at any one time we will continue to ask everyone to enter through the door off the parking lot facing the Office Building or the Back Ramp Door. You are welcome to leave through the front door following mass.

**Statue:** We are beginning the process of commissioning a piece of art for the opening where the door was located on Ingram Street. This will involve selecting an artist and a design. We have been generously blessed with a donation for the statue. Once the statue is installed then we will do a blessing of the whole project.

**Roof:** For the last couple of years we have been watching the roof closely knowing that a new roof was in our near future. Due to continued leaks and the damage that the water is causing the Building Committee and I decided that it was time to replace the roof. We advertised for bids and received four bids. From the bids we chose Preferred Roofing. A local company who had the lowest bid, which is just under a \$1 million dollars. Once again thanks to Mr. Alles and his generosity to the parish we do not have to approach the parish directly for funds to pay for this major expense. The plan is that they will begin the project as soon as possible and so scaffolding could appear in the next few weeks in the front of church. They will begin with the bell tower so that is where the first scaffolding will go up. Our plans are to continue to have mass in the church while this is going on.

**Multipurpose Room Project:** In a couple of weeks we will start a project in the Multi-purpose room to improve storage. The Youth Room and Bathrooms have a large space over them that could be used for storage. We are going to install a metal stairway and reinforce the ceiling/floor so as to be able to have storage. This will not prohibit the playing of volleyball or other activities in the building once it is all completed.

**The State of the Alles Estate:** At this point the estate has still not been finalized. We are waiting on a couple of details. What has happened up to this point is that is that the Diocese formed a LLC, entitled Holy Name Farms. After forming this LLC, the diocese closed out the various bonds that had not matured, by negotiating a reasonable early termination fee and placing that in the LLC. Of course the farms are listed as property of the LLC. The parish has entered into a contract with Field and Main to manage the farms for us. We have entered into another year contract with the two farmers who have been farming the land. We recently received a bid to purchase two of the plots of land by Mike Hagan, one of the farmers that we are in contract with. After getting some information and having a meeting we decided to allow the two plots to be sold as long as we can come up with an agreed price. When a farm is sold the money will be placed in the Holy Name Farms LLC and when the estate is finalized the money will be shifted to the parish to be invested in the Diocesan Fund.

**Miscellaneous:** At the end of the year we received two large donations. One that I mentioned earlier that will be used for the statue project. The other donation was placed in the general fund. As you probably have noticed if you follow the bulletin our collections have been down since the start of Covid. Many of our expenses are down also because we are not able to have the programs and events that we normally sponsor. The expenses are still outpacing the giving so this donation came at a good time. We do need to look at what we give to the parish because we cannot depend on these one-time gifts. We also want to make sure that Mr. Alles' generosity is here to serve the parish for many years. We should and can take care of ourselves and the needs of the parish at this time. I know that many people were and some are still laid off or not working the hours that they once did. I know that many cannot raise their giving or keep up with what they once gave. For those who are struggling please know of our prayers and if there is anything that we can do please let me know. The gift of community is that hopefully when some hurt others are able to help, and this switches around as time goes on. Please give what you can.

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary

Reflection

Early records in the Church show that the purpose and character of Lent is entirely derived from the great festival for which it prepares, Easter. The focus for the whole community was baptism, those who would be baptized and the renewal of their own baptismal promises. They spent the 40 days of Lent in prayer, fasting and almsgiving to prepare themselves to renew their commitment to reject sin so as to live in the freedom of God's children.

As we prepare for this Lenten season we too are called upon to pray, fast and give alms. It is important that as we plan on what to do during Lent that we plan in light of the baptismal renewal that we will be asked to make at Easter. So that when we stand with the community at our Easter celebration and profess "I do," it is not just words but comes from a heart renewed and enlivened by our Lenten practices.

At the beginning of Lent, we receive ashes, the ancient sign of sorrow, and hear one of two calls to repentance: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Or "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." This call to self-knowledge, repentance, and belief is the axis around which Lent revolves. We prepare to celebrate the Lord's Paschal Mystery by preparing to receive it as the entirely unearned gift that it is. Our preparation will not change the fact that we will "return to dust." Nor will they let us earn a place in God's Kingdom as something we deserve. The Good News is that salvation is a gift from Jesus that we simply have to accept.

Discipleship

Questions to help you decide what Lenten practices you would like perform during Lent.

- What form does "Satan" most powerfully take in your life?
- How can you bring a sense of stillness to your life this Lent?
- What you like to recreate and transform in your life this Lent?
- What temptation do you find hardest to resist?

I saw God

This week you will receive a letter with more information about Lenten opportunities in the parish. We are going to focus on a couple of Lenten practices:

- First we will focus on St. Joseph during this year of St. Joseph. At our Wednesday night masses we will reflect on some of the characteristics of St. Joseph as identified by Pope Francis. We will also use different prayers to St. Joseph throughout the season.
- Second we will focus on our baptism by looking at what we can do to better prepare ourselves to renew our baptismal promises. Next Sunday the first Sunday of Lent we will have baskets with small bottles of holy water for you to take home and use to bless yourself and family as you focus on the gift of baptism.
- Third we would like for the parish to focus our alms giving going to the Rice Bowl project. The Rice Bowl project encourages us to save money throughout the Lenten season to send to the mission work of Catholic Relief Service. We have Rice Bowl information at the entrance of Church.



**Faith Formation...**As Lent quickly approaches families are asked to create a **Family Lenten Plan**.

Question “How?” lead families to reflect on:

- how Jesus spiritually prepared/trained to begin His mission during His time in the desert.
- the power of uniting our sacrifices with Jesus’ sacrifice.

Looking at the *Spiritual & Corporal Works of Mercy* families began to recognize “works of mercy” in daily life. Then the question became “Who?” Families discussed which mercy or mercies are in action in their lives and who is best living it out. This led to “What?” What can we do as a family during the weeks of Lent to prepare spiritually/train ourselves for the mission God has given to them through their practice of praying, fasting, and almsgiving? Now the Plan begins to take shape.



Next families were asked to create a space in their home, or build onto the space that is currently sacred, where families gather and pray, share stories and offer encouragement to one another.


