

Sunday Readings for February 21, 2021

Reading 1 Gn 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth"


Gospel Mk 1:12-15



LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

First Sunday of Lent

Reflection

Each year on the first Sunday of Lent we hear in the Gospel the account of Jesus going into the desert for 40 days and 40 night before he begins his public ministry. Mark gives us few details, we have to turn to Matthew and Luke for more details. But the fact remains that between his baptism and his public ministry he spent 40 days in the desert. So each year as we prepare to celebrate our baptismal promises at Easter and welcome new members into the church with the gift of Baptism we too head metaphorically into the desert.

This idea of the desert has effected the way that we celebrate Lent. Often the Church is decorated with desert themes and at one point we would empty the holy water fonts and baptismal fonts to make things more desert like. You may have even reached into a holy water font to find sand.

This year we want to focus on water, the waters of life that we receive in Baptism. We have small bottles of holy water available for you to take home for your Lenten season. Use the holy water to sign yourself and bless all members of the family. Discuss and pray with water, its importance in our lives and especially the waters of baptism.

Discipleship

Spend time this Lent praying and reflecting on the gift of Baptism and the role it has in our lives.

Does Baptism effect the way that I live my life?

What can I do this Lenten season to better understand and live out my baptismal call to be a disciple of Christ?

Suggestion: Fix a light meal for the family dinner, the information from the Rice Bowl has many suggestions for a typical meal from many other countries. At the dinner table talk about how much it would cost for the family to go to your favorite restaurant and how much this meal cost. Take the extra money and put it in the Rice Bowl. Do not snack the rest of the evening, try to experience a little hunger.

I saw God

During these days of COVID my mother is not venturing outside of the house much. Weather permitting she goes to church on Wednesday and that is pretty much it. I was talking with her yesterday and she was going on and on about her many blessings. It was Sunday and I normally take her communion but a lady from her parish called and asked if she could bring it to her and that they were running to Wal-Mart and could they pick up anything for her. Most of us have heard the phrase “sitting is the new smoking” referring to the growing epidemic of sedentary lifestyles in the United States. But is this true? Is sitting in a chair *that bad* for you?

THE FACTS: Over 25% of American adults sit for more than 8 hours every day. 44% of those people get little to no exercise.

- The average American watches approximately 3 hours of television every day.
- The average American is active less than 20 minutes every day.

60-75 minutes of moderate activity (steady walking) can counter the effects of too much sitting.

THE SCIENCE: **Sitting** can be *so relaxing*. Why is it so bad? Here’s what happens when you spend too much time sitting:

- Blood flow slows down. This can allow fatty acids to build up in the blood vessels, leading to heart disease.
- Sitting for extended periods of time, regularly may lead to insulin resistance which can cause type 2 diabetes and obesity—2 major risk factors for heart disease.
- A 2018 study found that 82% of people who suffer from blood clots, sat for a significantly greater amount of time than the remaining 18%.

Your body’s ability to process fats is slowed. When you sit, your body’s production of lipoprotein lipase (an enzyme essential for breaking down fat) drops by about 90%. When your body cannot break down fat, it is stored instead.

THE SOLUTION: Sitting is inevitable! Here’s how you can ward off any negative side effects:

- **Set a timer.** Get up every hour and move. Stand, walk around, stretch. You can even download apps onto your phone to remind you!
- **Watch your posture.** Poor posture can lead to bone damage, decreased blood circulation, fatigue, and loss of muscle strength. If you must sit, keep your shoulders back, your chin tucked, and your stomach pulled toward your spine in order to keep muscles engaged, bones aligned, and circulation flowing.
- **Take a stand.** If you’re able, why not opt for a standing desk? Not only will your heart thank you, but standing desks have been proven to increase brain function, creativity, and productivity.
- **Work it out.** Commit to exercising every single day. Go on a walk during lunch. Plan to attend a fitness class. Choose the far parking spot. Every minute of physical activity counts!

Rosary Devotions

Tuesday, 6:00pm

Here is how to pray the St. Joseph Chaplet:

- Make the Sign of the Cross.
- Offer any intentions you may have.
- On the white bead, announce the Mystery, and say two Hail Marys.

On each of the three blue/purple beads, say: “Praised and blessed be Jesus, Mary, and Joseph!”

End the chaplet with the following prayer:

V. Pray for us, O holy St. Joseph!

R. That we may be made worthy of the promise of Christ!

V. Let us pray.

O God, Who has predestined St. Joseph from all eternity for the service of Thine Eternal Son and His Blessed Mother, and made him worthy to be the spouse of this Blessed Virgin and the foster father of Thy Son: we beseech Thee, through all the services he has rendered to Jesus and Mary on earth, that Thou wouldst make us worthy of his intercession and grant us to enjoy the happiness of his company in Heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.




