

Reading 1 Gn 22:1-2,9a,10-13,15-18

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you."

When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son.

Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing—all this because you obeyed my command."

If God is for us, who can be against us?


He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him?

Gospel Mk 9:2-10

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.



Reflection Questions for the Readings for February 28, 2021

In the first reading, God tells Abraham, "Do not lay your hand on the boy...Do not do the least thing to him." How does your community teach and embrace nonviolence?

The psalmist tells us, "I believed, even when I said, 'I am greatly afflicted.'" When have you persevered in faith despite difficulty or suffering?

St. Paul asks, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" What fears do you experience in the spiritual life that this statement could help counteract?

In the gospel, a voice from the cloud says, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." How do you take time in prayer not only to talk, but also to listen to Jesus?



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him," This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?

Second Sunday of Lent

Reflection

You may ask the question, “Why on the Second Sunday of Lent do we always hear an account of the Transfiguration?” It seems out of place with the fasting and penance of the season. The answer or part of an answer could come from the words that come from the cloud, “This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.” At the river Jordon after his baptism by John the Baptist Jesus hears a voice from heavens saying, “You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased.” The first message an intimate message to a beloved Son and the second message an encouragement of who Jesus is and the importance of the disciples to listen to him.

Jesus before they ventured up the mountain top had told the disciples that he must die and rise to new life. They had argued with him and were convinced that they could find another way. Jesus will tell them two more times that he must be handed over, tortured, put to death and rise again. Gods’ words to the disciples are listen to him.

The news may not be what we want but we must listen to the Word of God. We may still struggle with the wisdom of taking up our cross and following him or to save our life we must lose it, but it is in the cross that we will find life. The life of Christ and the life that we seek. The Transfiguration reminds us of the life that awaits us if we can take up our cross. We will be encouraged to take the easy way but Jesus reminds us that the only way that works is the Cross.

Discipleship

Today’s first reading, the story of Abraham’s willingness to sacrifice his only son, brings us face-to-face with a God who calls us to total trust even as he entrusts his only Son to us. Isaac suffered no harm, but may children in the world are truly in danger. Catholic Relief Services (CRS; www.crs.org) devotes may projects to children, especially concerning child labor and human trafficking. Follow your heart. Whatever you do pray for the children who have no one to speak for them. Find out more about child labor and human trafficking and ways to get involved. Henderson has a higher percentage of human trafficking cases than Evansville. Why? What can we do?

I saw God

When I get a chance I like to watch CBS Sunday Morning. It is a show that seems to focus on people and their stories in a positive way. They are really good about finding extraordinary people across America who are living ordinary lives. This morning they did a story on a Pizza Delivery Person. This gentleman has been delivering Pizza for 31 years. Now some may think that this is something NOT to brag about and he even said that his family keeps trying to get him to get a better job. But he really enjoys his job and is able to live simply and get by on what we earns. He does more than just deliver pizza, he is thoughtful and attentive to his customers. By this point he knows most of them and has delivered to their homes many times. Recently one of his customers decided to tip him appropriate to the service that he provides. He went online with his idea and within 2 days he had raised \$12,000 and was able to buy him a good used car, a year of insurance, and gas. The gentlemen agreed that many people think that his job is not that important but he believes that the most important job is the one you have.

EAT SMART

Tuna Burgers

Makes 6 servings/Serving Size: 1 patty

Ingredients

- 2 (4.5 ounce) cans low-sodium tuna, packed in water
- 1 cup bread crumbs, divided
- 1 cup reduced-fat cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1/2 cup non-fat Ranch salad dressing
- 1/4 cup onion, finely chopped
- Non-stick cooking spray



Directions

1. Drain tuna, separate into flakes using a fork.
2. In a medium bowl, combine tuna, 1/2 cup bread crumbs, cheese, egg, salad dressing, and onion.
3. Form six patties; coat each side with remaining 1/2 cup bread crumbs.
4. Spray non-stick skillet with cooking spray; heat to medium heat.
5. Cook patties 3-5 minutes on each side until golden brown and internal temperature of each patty reaches 160F.

Hint: Serve on whole-wheat buns. Add lettuce, tomato, cucumbers, and shredded carrots as condiments to build a healthy burger.

Parish Faith Formation...as the weeks of Lent progress many opportunities arise in our parish for families. At the weekend liturgies families are encouraged to sign-up and train as Hospitality Ministers. This ministry allows families to serve together. Serving together allows mentorship to be learned and modeled for children and it allows parents to walk with children in learning the lessons of hospitality Jesus taught.

Another opportunity is SoulCore this is saying the rosary with movement. If parents are wanting to teach children the rosary why not do it by partnering healthy movement? No matter your age or ability, there is a place for you and your family.

Wednesdays of Lent we are focusing on St. Joseph. We will begin after noon mass with either St. Joseph Chapelet or 7Sorrows and 7Joys of Joseph. A guided handout is given to participants. At 4:30pm SoulCore will pray either 7Sorrows or 7Joys of Joseph with movement. This workout is at a quicker pace than the rosary. There will even be a space available for anyone wanting to join the prayer while resisting the movement. Also on Wednesday there will be 5:30pm mass in which the homily will highlight messages centering on St. Joseph's point of view, qualities and characteristics.

On Fridays of Lent following the noon mass the traditional Stations of the Cross are prayed as a group. Using a guide, *Mary's Way of the Cross*, the group will be led station by station reflecting and responding.

A schedule for all these opportunities are highlighted within the hallway bulletin board. Check for times and place. Please join us and explore the possibilities of change that may be happening in your heart, head and body during the weeks leading to Easter.


