

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they, or humanity as a whole, are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If all of us kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with human beings, indeed with our very self, then there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us. Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name," By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done.

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Reflection

“The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat;” (John 12-23-24)

The hour is almost here. Where has Lent gone? I hope that your Lenten discipline has been like grains of wheat that have yielded rich fruit. If you have not been able to stay with or fulfill your Lenten discipline do not get discouraged. Fasting, prayer and helping the poor (almsgiving) should be a part of our life always. We traditionally focus on these practices during Lent but they should continue throughout the year.

Today’s gospel reading takes place only a few days before Jesus’s crucifixion and death. In Jesus’s crucifixion, we are freed from the chains of death and powers of evil, and this is all accomplished in the most peaceful and nonviolent manner possible. Jesus offers no resistance to the crowd that demands his death. Despite his ability to feed five thousand people with only a few loaves and fishes and his power to calm a storm with a word, Jesus uses no spiritual force to climb down from the cross he has been raised up on. Instead, as we read every Good Friday from John’s gospel, when the time of his death arrives, he proclaims, “It is finished,” bows his head, and hands over his spirit (19:30; NABRE). In all he does, Jesus has faith in God who can bring life from death, and does so each day in the fruits of creation.

Discipleship

Jesus tells us that he, like a grain of wheat, must fall to the ground and die in order to bear fruit for God’s Kingdom. Lenten observances of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving similarly help us to die to ourselves and our selfishness and draw us closer to him. In prayer, ask God to show you when and where during your life you have been charitable to others. What stands out? Is God calling you to be charitable in a specific way today? Is there a relationship in your life in need of healing? What steps can you take, in charity and with God’s grace, to mend what is broken? Consider seeking counsel or support as you work toward reconciliation.

I saw God

This past week I have had 4 funerals in the parish. Four women who were daughters, sisters, friends, wives, mothers, grandmothers, some were great grandmothers and some were great great grandmothers. Each one of them made a lasting impact on their family, their friends and our parish community.

In listening to their stories as told by loved ones with laughter and tears I was overwhelmed by the great goodness of our God. The fruits of their lives were evident in the simple stories and memories of their family and friends. From gingerbread house making parties with grandkids to going dancing with their husband. From card games, to travel, to making quilts and afghans for family and teaching many others to do so. From working in the yard and garden to spending time with grandchildren. I know that these women were not perfect but they loved and were loved and what more can we ask.

The 7 Best Times to Drink Water / EVERYDAY HEALTH



Drinking water is a critical part of overall health for your body. You may prefer water with ice, filtered, or infused with fruit but make sure you are drinking enough!

Here are some tips about staying hydrated throughout the day.

1. When you wake up each day, drink One to Two glasses of water.
2. To Help with Hunger, try a glass of water before a meal.
3. Have a glass of water to help digestion as you eat your meal.
4. In the afternoon when you have a downward slide of energy, have a glass of water instead of a cup of coffee.
5. Drink water when you have a headache. You could be showing signs of dehydration.


