

Sunday Readings for March 28, 2021

At the Procession with Psalm-Gospel

Mk 11:1-10

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem, To Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you, 'Why are you doing this?' reply, 'The Master has need of it and will send it back here at once.'" So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. Some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They answered them just as Jesus had told them to, and they permitted them to do it. So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. And he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out: "Hosanna!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come!

Hosanna in the highest!"

Reading 1 **Is 50:4-7**

The Lord GOD has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them. Morning after morning he opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled, have not turned back. I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

Responsorial Psalm **22:8-9,17-18,19-20,23-24**

All who see me scoff at me; they mock me with parted lips, they wag their heads: "He relied on the LORD; let him deliver him, let him rescue him, if he loves him."

Indeed, many dogs surround me, a pack of evildoers closes in upon me; They have pierced my hands and my feet; I can count all my bones.

They divide my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots. But you, O LORD, be not far from me; O my help, hasten to aid me.

Reading 2 **Phil 2:6-11**

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped.

Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father

Reflection Questions for the Readings for March 28, 2021

The prophet Isaiah proclaims, "The Lord God has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them." How do homilies in your parish serve to "rouse the weary"?

Today's psalm echoes the words of Jesus on the cross: "My God, why have you abandoned me?" How do you strive to reach out to those who might feel abandoned?

At the Mount of Olives, Jesus tells the disciples, "All of you will have your faith shaken." What role does questioning or doubt have in the spiritual life?

After his death, a centurion says of Jesus, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" What has Jesus done in your life that inspires you to say the same?



Inspiration for the week

What an ironic twist of events! Jesus is hailed with palm branches as he comes down a street one minute and faces agonizing suffering and death on a cross the next. Does any of this make any sense? They shouted, "hosanna to our King," out of one side of their mouths and, "crucify him," out of the other. At first glance it seems like such hypocrisy. Yet, when we step back there may be more truth to the story than we care to admit. We struggle with Jesus. We hail him in our churches but struggle to figure out what to do with him on our streets. We are fine when we hear pious renderings of his messages and preaching but wince when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct business and becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God's name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Reflection

Forty days are almost done and Holy Week is right around the corner. Sunday is Palm Sunday. The beginning of the most sacred week of our church year. In Holy Week we celebrate the events in the life of Christ that are at the heart of our salvation.

The Sacred Triduum refers to the three days, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.

Holy Thursday April 1, 2021 7:00 PM

Holy Thursday is the day we remember the First Eucharist. Jesus at supper with his disciples broke bread and said "This is my Body." He shared the cup and said "This is my Blood." Two thousand years later we continue to celebrate and remember.

The Gospel for the night is Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. Due to COVID we will not be able to wash feet but we will still focus on the call to service we receive in the Eucharist.

Good Friday April 2, 2021 7:00 PM

We come to the wood of the cross of Christ. We give thanks for his overwhelming love that led him to shed his blood for our sins. We read the Passion account from John and we venerate the cross. Due to COVID we will not be able to touch or kiss the cross but rather we ask that you give a sign of reverence by genuflecting or bowing.

Holy Saturday April 3, 2021 8:00 PM

At the Easter Vigil we celebrate the new life we receive from God. We light the new fire, we bless the new water of Baptism, we welcome new members into our community through water and oil. Ben Zollner will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive Eucharist for the first time. Ami Latta and Joshua Bell will be welcomed into the Church, Confirmed and receive Eucharist.

Easter Sunday April 4, 2021

7:30 am, 9:30 am, 11:30am, 1:30pm and 5:30pm

We arise with the sun to celebrate the rising of the Son. Throughout the day we celebrate that he is risen from the Dead. Death no longer has power over us since we have received eternal life from our Lord. We renew our baptismal promises and be sprinkle

Better Homes & Gardens Easter Egg Fruit Pizza

Give your fruit pizza a holiday twist by shaping and decorating like an Easter Egg. This easy fruit pizza recipe will be a hit at your Easter brunch.

Bake: 15 minutes to 18 minutes at 350 degrees

Servings: 12

Max Servings: 16

Ingredients

2 - 16 ounces packages sugar cookie dough
1- 16 container frozen whipped topping, thawed
1- 8 ounce package cream cheese, softened
Assorted fruit such as: Berries, pineapple, oranges,
kiwi, and/ or bananas
Honey (optional)
Pastel sprinkles (Optional)



Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350. On a large sheet of parchment, gently press cookie dough into a 14x10-inch egg-shape. Bake 15 to 18 minutes or until brown around the edges. Cool completely.

Step 2

In a medium bowl combine whipped topping and cream cheese. Spread topping mixture over cooled cookie. Carefully draw egg pattern out line in the topping mixture with a skewer or toothpick. Decorate cookie with desired fruit*. Drizzle with honey and top with sprinkles, if desired.

*cut your fruit into different shapes with small cookie cutters for a more festive look!

Parish Faith Formation... this weekend marks the end...and the beginning. How can that be? Palm Sunday as Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a donkey everyone praises and shouts His name. 
