

Sunday Readings for April 11, 2021

Reading 1 Acts 4:32-35

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need.

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

Gospel Jn 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them,, “Peace be with you.” When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.”

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.”

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, “Peace be with you.”

Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.” Thomas answered and said to him, “My Lord and my God!” Jesus said to him, “Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.”

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Reflection Questions for the Readings

for April 11, 2021

Today, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday. Where is God calling you to extend mercy to others?

In the first reading we hear that the early community of believers were all of “one heart and mind.” Where in your own parish is the community of one mind about issues or values? Where is their division?

The second reading from the first letter of St John proclaims that “God commandments are not burdensome.” At this moment in your journey, where are you encountering burden or hardship?

In today’s gospel Jesus tells the disciples, “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” Where are you being sent to share Jesus’s peace?



LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Reflection

John concludes his Gospel with an explanation of why he included the signs of Jesus that he did. "These are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name." (John 21:31)

In the Gospel of John, he uses the verb "believe," 98 times because as he states above, this is essential. Believing does not mean merely acting as if something is real. Believing means developing the spiritual faculty to perceive the invisible reality at the heart of things, similar to the way that we see and hear the sights and sounds around us. Two levels of seeing or believing are at work in John's Gospel. Physical seeing or believing leads to a simplistic form of faith (John 6:30 "what sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you?"), which remains tied to earthly forms of existence. But for John, true believing enables one to see beyond physical sight.

Thomas gets caught in this dilemma when the Resurrected Jesus appears to the disciples and Thomas is not there. Thomas states that he will not be able to believe unless he can see and touch Jesus. Jesus then returns and says to Thomas, do what you need to do just do not be unbelieving.

For the early Christian communities, Apostles were those who had the honor of being an eyewitness to the Risen Christ. "What we have seen with our eyes...and touched with our hands...we proclaim now to you" (1John1:1-4). But the Gospel focuses its attention on the ordinary Christian and their task of believing. For John believing in Jesus is the important step. Apostles might have seen Jesus, but they must learn to believe. Thomas moves from in one instant from earthly to spiritual believing. Jesus teaches that anyone who knows him through believing is equal to the Apostles, who know him by sight.

The power of believing is seen in the early Christian community. People flocked to them because of their message and their passion. The early Christian community became one heart and one soul.

I saw God

The opportunities have been endless lately. The beautiful Holy Week services and the larger crowds. Seeing people that I have not seen in a year was especially wonderful. Welcoming three new members into our church at the Easter Vigil especially after being able to spend time with them during Lent in a retreat setting. Being with the staff and parishioners as we prepared for the celebrations and decorating the church. The wonderful weather on Easter Sunday and the beautiful flowers and blooming bushes and trees. The new life of the Easter Season was very evident this year and a true sign of the Resurrection and the new life in Christ. The wonderful children just being themselves. For me the face of God was at every turn and in every moment. Alleluia, The Lord is Risen!

COVID 19 Vaccination Complete.... NOW WHAT?

COVID-19 vaccines are effective at protecting you from getting sick. Based on what we know about COVID-19 vaccines, people who have been fully vaccinated can start to do some things that they had stopped doing because of the pandemic.

We're still learning how vaccines will affect the spread of COVID-19. After you've been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, you should keep taking precautions – like wearing a mask, staying 6 feet apart from others, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces – in public places until we know more.

These recommendations can help you make decisions about daily activities after you are fully vaccinated. They are *not* intended for healthcare settings.

Have You Been Fully Vaccinated?

People are considered fully vaccinated:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

If you don't meet these requirements, you are NOT fully vaccinated. Keep taking all precautions until you are fully vaccinated.
