

## Sunday Readings for May 9, 2021

### Reading 1 Acts 10:2-26,34-35,44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God.

Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

### Gospel Jn 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love."

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

### Reflection Questions for the Readings for May 9, 2021

In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter tells the kneeling Cornelius to "get up. I myself am also a human being." Are there spiritual leaders you tend to idolize or place on a pedestal?

Today's responsorial psalm invites us to sing to the Lord a new song. Where is God calling you to newness in the spiritual life?

In his first letter, St. John tells us, "This is love; not that we have loved God, but that he loved us." In your relationship with God, do you find yourself more comfortable pondering your love for God or God's love for you?

In the gospel, Jesus expresses his desire that "my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." Where do you find your greatest joy at this moment in your life?

## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

God is love. These three simple words deserve a great deal of attention. They have the power to transform our relationship with God from something that is static and distant to one that is personal and real. We all know the power of love and how important it is to completing all of the human and divine circuits of our lives. But we do not often consider the awesome fact that it is given to us as a gift and is not simply part and parcel of the human package. God is the author of love and love itself. When we truly love another human being, it is really God being God in and through us. The love to which we are called and the love of which the Gospel speaks is a selfless love that seeks the wellbeing of not only our significant others but of all of our brothers and sisters. This love, which is of God, is a love that will endure all things and bring immeasurable joy when experienced. It is the most sincere form of friendship.

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Reflection

*“I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you.”*

Jesus asks us to love one another as he has loved us: to put others before ourselves, to seek our joy in bringing joy to others, to honor and cherish others simply because they are sons and daughters of the God of mercy and compassion.

*Love one another* – with no qualifications, conditions, or limitations.

*Love one another* – without judgement, measurements or expectations of a return.

*Love one another* – even the undeserving, the mean-spirited, the ungrateful, and the unreasonable.

Such love can be overwhelmingly demanding, but such love can be the source of “complete” joy and fulfillment, love that is no less than experience of the Easter resurrection.

Loving one another is much more than a feel-good moment. Just ask any married person, parent or person living in community. Every Sunday we have another opportunity to practice this kind of love. In the assembly, we are called to love especially those we do not know, those who live their faith different than we believe, those we hold a grudge against, or those who we believe act like they are better than we are. There are many ways to show love, greeting them, not gossiping about them with others, praying to God each and every day for the ability to love that specific individual.

Living as a Disciple

Is there an individual or a group that you find difficult to love? In prayer, ask for God’s heart of love and forgiveness. Pray this way each day until you can hold them in God’s love. Make an effort to get to know the “other” in the world.

I Saw God

The love of a mother is a clear image of God’s presence in our life. It is a love that is often overlooked but desperately missed when it is gone. Fortunately, my mother is still living and is in good health. During the pandemic we kept Mom as isolated as possible for her health. We would go to visit or take her supplies which were all delivered at the back door. Since Easter and the vaccine we have enjoyed spending time together, in the same room without masks. Some of the highlights: Seeing her hold the youngest child in the family on the day he was baptized, her patting the very pregnant belly of her grandson’s wife, eating her favorite meal from Red Lobster which was carried into the house by the baby of the family with tears rolling down her face because it had been a year since she had seen Mom, her commenting many times on how she would always sew up a hole in our jeans when we were kids this was usually brought on by my niece and her two daughters who were wearing jeans purchased with holes in them, the sparkle in her eye when each child, grandchild, great grandchild, and their spouses came into the house. Hopefully Mother’s Day is one of celebration for you, whether in person or memory.

- For mothers who have lost a child through death, that their faith may give them hope, and their family and friends support and console them.
- For mothers who have died, that God may bring them into the joy of his kingdom.

Bread for the World is an organization that urges our nation's decision makers to end hunger at home and abroad. Every year, they identify policies that can help reduce hunger. People across the nation then write letters to their members of Congress about these policies. The goal is to flood the offices of our elected officials in Washington, D.C. with letters and emails on these issues so that they know that we, as Christians and as their constituents, care about issues that affect people living with hunger and poverty. By changing policies, programs, and conditions

that allow hunger and poverty to persist, we provide help and opportunity.

In 2020, Bread for the World's "Offering of Letters" campaign helped pass the bipartisan Global Nutrition Resolution. Participants successfully advocated for COVID relief that included an increase to food assistance and expanded a program that helps children access nutrition while schools are closed.

Bread for the World's 2021 "Offering of Letters" focuses on urging Congress to pass legislation that expands the Child Tax Credit as a measure to end hunger and malnutrition in the US. Holy Name Social Action Ministry extends an invitation to parishioners to participate in this year's "Offering of Letters" during the week of May 30.
