## Sunday Readings for May 16, 2021

### Reading 1 Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.

### Gospel Mk 16:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.”

So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God. But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.

### Reflection Questions for the Readings for May 16, 2021

In the first reading Matthias is chosen to join the apostles as a “witness to Jesus’s resurrection.” In your journey of faith, who have been the most effective witnesses for you of Jesus’s light and life?

In today’s second reading we hear the familiar statement “God is love.” As a Christian, how do you try to live this truth?

In today’s gospel, Jesus prays to God that his disciples “may be one just as we are one.” What is the biggest obstacle to unity in your parish church? How might God be calling you to address this?

This is our final week of the Easter season. How has your relationship with Jesus been renewed throughout this time of celebration?



Seventh Sunday of Easter

Reflection

On the feast of the Ascension we remember Jesus's words to his closest friends before he was taken up to heaven: "Go into the whole world / and proclaim the gospel to every creature." Today these words are addressed to us as the members of the Body of Christ alive in the world. For the apostles, this commissioning meant introducing people to the person of the risen Lord, the vast majority of which had never heard the name Jesus of Nazareth. As they walked this path the apostles met with persecution and eventually martyrdom. In a way, for those of us who live in countries where Christianity is a protected religion, our journey as disciples doesn't seem anywhere near as difficult or dangerous.

In the past two thousand years many places in the world have encountered an initial proclamation of the gospel, and yet in some ways that can be an obstacle for us as we endeavor to be "witnesses" to the good news. While our history includes many saints, there are also those who have repelled others from Christianity by their actions and words. In an interview with a Christian missionary, Mahatma Gandhi was asked, "Though you quote the words of Christ often, why is it that you so adamantly reject becoming his follower?" To this, Gandhi reportedly replied, "Oh, I don't reject your Christ. I love your Christ. It is just that so many of you Christians are so unlike your Christ."

The Life of the Disciple

As the Apostles watch Jesus ascend into heaven, two angelic figures ask: "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" Their message seems twofold: "Don't worry, he'll be back," and "Get on with it!" Indeed, the rest of the Acts of the Apostles is about how Jesus works through his people, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to bring about God's purposes. How might the Holy Spirit be moving you toward action in the world? In what ways are we called to action?

I Saw God

Every time I celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation I am reminded of the powerful encounter with God's love that is a part of the sacrament. The trust the one confessing places in the priest is truly humbling. Merely human we do our best to stand in as a representative for God. Hopefully the priest receives with great reverence and care and communicates with compassion the forgiveness of sin and the great love of our God. In just a few moments the light of the resurrected Lord shines on the darkest corners of our life. In that light we do not see condemnation but the love and acceptance of our loving Savior who died so that we might be forgiven of our sins.

The effects of childhood poverty can last a lifetime. Children growing up in poverty are more likely to experience high levels of stress and malnutrition. Stress in the home can often be traced to a lack of finances to provide basic needs. Research shows that both stress and malnutrition negatively impact brain development. Long term effects result in lower productivity, higher healthcare costs, increases in homelessness, child abuse, and incarceration. The Child Tax Credit (CTC) makes additional funds available to low-income families with children. Unfortunately, some families are excluded from these benefits. Expanding the CTC will do more to reduce hunger and poverty among our nation's children than any single policy has in decades. Join our Offering of Letters to Congress advocating for CTC benefits for all children living in poverty. Our letter writing campaign takes place the week of May 30.

### PREVENTING A STROKE: 5 Steps

#### If you smoke, quit

[Studies show](#) that for every five cigarettes a person smokes each day, the risk of having a stroke goes up by 12%. For Black adults, smoking cigarettes more than doubles the risk of stroke compared to never smoking, a [2020 study](#) found.

#### Move more

More active men and women have a 25%-30% lower risk of stroke than those who are least active. Physical activity has been shown to lower cholesterol, help maintain a healthy weight and lower blood pressure – all factors that can reduce stroke risk.

#### Keep blood pressure under control

High blood pressure, also called hypertension, is the leading cause of strokes. Half of all men – 52% – and 43% of women in the U.S. have blood pressure that is too high, according to [AHA statistics](#). While it can be controlled through lifestyle changes or by taking medication, only about 1 in 5 adults keep it properly managed. Smoking, diabetes, obesity, high cholesterol and eating an unhealthy diet can push blood pressure out of the healthy range.

#### Eat a healthy diet


"One of the most subtle things that happens to people as they get older is they put on weight," Hachinski said. "Nutrition is more important than weight loss," agreed Bushnell. "There are multiple diets shown to decrease the risk of stroke," such as the Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension (DASH) or Mediterranean diets. Both emphasize eating a lot of fruits, vegetables and low-fat dairy, whole grains, fish and nuts, while cutting back on foods high in saturated fats, cholesterol and trans fats.

#### Start early

Strokes happen to young people, too. [About 10%-15% of all strokes](#) occur in adults age 50 or under. [Recent research shows](#) Black young adults have up to four times the risk as their white peers.

And recent research shows the same factors that cause strokes in older adults – such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol, obesity and diabetes – are causing strokes in younger adults.
