Reading 1 Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. 

New Mass Schedule

Next weekend, we will resume our Sunday mass schedule that we started with COVID.

Saturday at 4:00pm and

Sunday at 7:30am, 10:30am,

1:30pm (Mass in Spanish) and 5:30pm.

We announced this schedule because of the restrictions from COVID, fewer people coming to church and the need to have more time to sanitize the church after each service. At Easter we expected larger crowds and decided to return to our old mass schedule for the Easter Season to provide enough room for everyone who wanted to celebrate. Now that we are coming to the end of the Easter Season and many of the restrictions have been lifted we are going to return to just two masses on Sunday morning rather than three.

Some of you may be wondering why, if we are getting back to normal, that we are reducing the number of masses. The number of masses that we have on the weekend have been a part of the staff's ongoing discussion way before the pandemic. Here are some of the reasons that we wanted to reduce the number of masses.

I wanted more time on Sunday for the community to gather for prayer, continuing education and spiritual growth. With the extra time on Sunday morning we could have small group discussions, book studies, family groups and varied prayer experience.

We were struggling to get enough ministers for our masses. We were having to rely on the same ministers over and over and with fewer masses we are hoping to be able to involve more people in ministry.

Canon Law states that a priest can only say one mass on Sunday and with the permission of the Bishop on special cases can celebrate two masses. The custom has become that two masses on Sunday is the norm for most priest and in some parishes such as Holy Name the priest celebrate three and sometimes more. We have allowed numerous masses on Sunday without considering how it divides the community into different groups and for the most part they do not know one another. We are to be one body in Christ and the more we worship together the better we can be, One Body.

COVID RESTRICTIONS

I believe that many of us were surprised by the very quick changes in the COVID restrictions. I was expecting to have to encourage everyone to continue to wear their masks as we decreased social distancing last weekend. Instead an announcement from the CDC and an email from the diocese and we are able to get rid of masks and move to more normalcy. I believe we will want to ease into this new level of restriction knowing that some people will not feel as comfortable as others with not wearing a mask and the closer social distance. We seem to be back at the beginning when we were hearing a variety of different opinions about what to do. I believe that if we use two guiding principles we will be able to make wise decisions.

Love one another! At the heart of the message of Jesus is this very simple refrain. It is one that he returned to over and over again because he knew that we needed to hear it over and over again. I hope that we could all agree that this is very important in the life of a Christian but sometimes how we carry this out looks very different. We can be very unloving at the very time we are called to the greatest love. In the midst of the pandemic when people were confused, suffering and scared many others were angry and critical. We must lay aside our differences and seek to love one another. To be humble enough to let go of what I want to see what my brother or sister needs.

Do not condemn and you will not be condemned. Jesus calls us not to judge but to listen to and seek to understand where our neighbor is coming from. It is easy to quickly judge someone by what they say or what they wear without understanding why they say what they say or wear what they wear. As we hopefully come out of this time of pandemic let us commit ourselves to be more understanding and less judgmental, and to be more loving and less angry. Let us reach out to one another in love and seek to understand our brother and sister. Let us rediscover the art of conversation rather than lobbing opinions at one another like bombs hoping to win.

Many families living in poverty run out of money and food stamps well before the end of the month. One in four children in the US are at risk of hunger. The Child Tax Credit can help ensure children have food all month.

The Child Tax Credit benefits have increased and been extended for 1 more year. Benefits will be received in monthly payments which will help stretch family food dollars each month. These changes will have a significant impact. But we must work to make the expansion permanent and available to all children, including those living in poverty and in immigrant families with ITIN numbers. We must be a voice for those with no voice. Join our Offering of Letters to Congress advocating for CTC benefits for all children living in poverty. Our letter writing campaign takes place the week of May 30.

Strawberry Crumble

Skinny up a classic with this version of the crumble. The oats and sliced almonds give you a nice dose of fiber and protein, which is great way to power up.

Prep:20 mins **Total:**30 mins **Yield:** Serves: 6

Ingredients

Ingredient Checklist

- 1 1/2 pounds' strawberries, hulled and quartered
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 tablespoons packed light brown sugar
- 6 tablespoons almond meal (or all-purpose flour)
- 1/3 cup rolled oats
- 3 tablespoons sliced almonds, coarsely chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons cold unsalted butter, cut into pieces



Directions

Instructions Checklist

Step 1 Place a rack in center of oven and preheat to 375°F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil. Grease and flour an 8-inch square baking dish or coat with baking spray and place on foil-lined sheet. In prepared baking dish, toss strawberries with lemon juice. Stir together flour and 1 Tbsp. brown sugar and toss with strawberries to coat.

Step 2 In a medium bowl, stir together almond meal, oats, almonds, baking powder, cinnamon, salt and remaining 2 Tbsp. brown sugar. Rub in butter with your fingers until mixture is crumbly. Press into small lumps and sprinkle over strawberries. Bake until top is golden brown and fruit is bubbling, about 30 minutes.


