First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Welcome to Ordinary Time. This is the time of the Church year when we focus on the daily life of Christ and followers. This year our readings will come primarily from the Gospel of Luke.

In this first part of Ordinary Time, between now and Ash Wednesday on March 2 we will also hear from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians in the second reading at Sunday mass. On the USCCB website they claim that this letter gives us a fuller insight into the life of the early Christian community than any other book in the New Testament. It is thought that this letter was written around 56 AD, making it very close to the death and resurrection of Jesus.

This is a community that came to believe in Jesus Christ from the teaching of St. Paul. They believed in Jesus as their Lord and God and left behind the Jewish or pagan temples. But the initial excitement is over and they are trying to figure out how to live this faith. Paul gets word that there are some problems in the community, drinking, believers are divided into cliques and factions, many marriages are in disarray, a group is dabbling in pagan spirituality, the liberals, the charismatics, and the traditionalist are trumpeting their version of the church and Masses are being shortened so that they can attend the chariot races.

Does Corinth sound familiar? The specifics may be a little different, substitute UK basketball for chariot races and it could be Henderson, 2022. Paul in his response to the community provides us with many valuable examples of his method of theological reflection and understanding. Certain passages of the letter are of the greatest importance in the understanding of early Christian teaching of the Eucharist and on the resurrection of the Body.

The section that we will read in these weeks of Ordinary Time deals with; gifts of the Holy Spirit, the community as the body of Christ, the importance of Love and the resurrection of Jesus. In my letter I will focus on this letter. Sharing some insights, providing some questions for reflection and encouraging us to read the full letter to see the wealth of this letter.

We begin in Chapter 12 of the First Letter to the Corinthians. Paul addresses the issue of spiritual gifts, different forms of service and different workings. The community is becoming divided on the issue of gifts, they are much more impressed with the gifts that they feel are of greater worth. Study shows that some of the community was very interested in the gift of tongues and the interpretation of tongues. They discount the other gifts and therefore discount those who have those gifts.

Paul prepares us for his image of the Body of Christ by saying that there are different gifts, service and works but there is only one God who produces all of them in everyone. Paul reminds the community that who they are and the gifts that they have are given to them by God, the one true God; Father Son, and Holy Spirit.

"But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes."
I Corinthians 12: 11

Questions:

Have you ever received an amazing gift? How did it make you feel?

Do you believe that you have received a gift from the Holy Spirit? What is that gift?

Do you see gifts that others have and find yourself Jealous of them?

Does our society praise certain gifts more than others? What are those gifts?

Family Activity:

Gather together and discuss the gifts that you have. Make sure that everyone can come up with a gift for themselves and if not share with them the gift you see in them. Talk about how our gifts do not make us better than others but are gifts from God and they are given to us to be able to help others.





LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.


One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.
