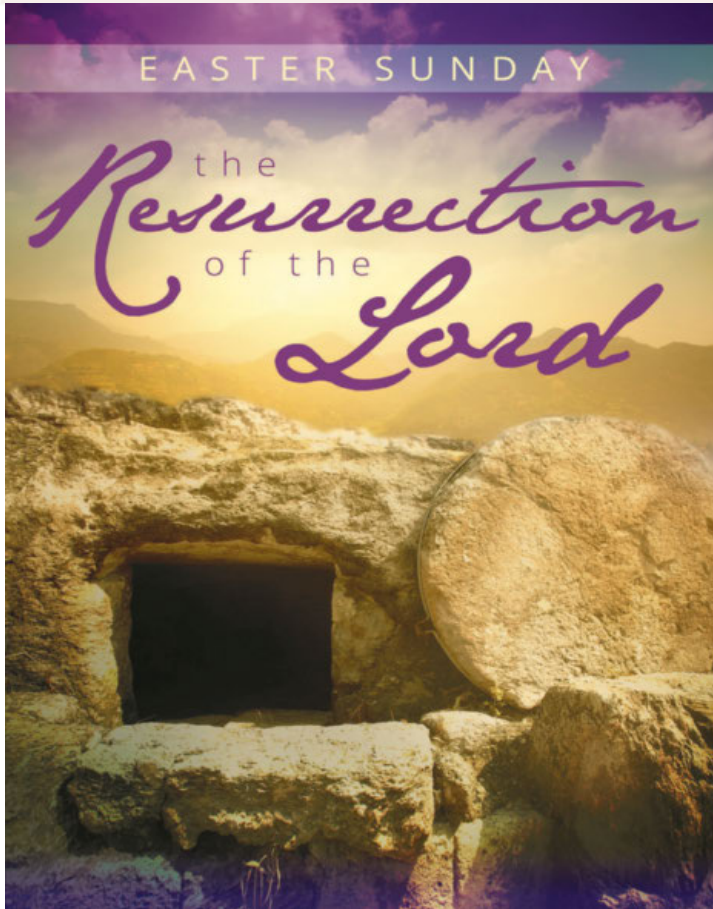

HIS RISEN PRESENCE

Pastor's Greetings,

Christian hope is neither optimism nor wishful thinking. It is the abiding certainty given by God that Jesus Christ has kept, is keeping, and will keep his promise to each and to all, that his victory already is and will be ours, and that nothing given to God is ever lost. Hope stands on the bedrock of faith, and together, faith and hope are the underpinnings of love. Faith, primarily, is the self-revealing God personally grasping us and our assent to God's hand, our taking God's truth and goodness to heart. This gives rise to hope, the embraced certainty that what God has begun in us will be fulfilled completely through the faithful action of Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. By faith and hope we know, we experience, the love of God and are enabled in this grace to love in God. Saint Paul said in 1 Corinthians 13, "Faith, hope, and love abide, these three, and the greatest of these is love." Love is the pinnacle borne up by the virtues of faith and hope, by which humanity reflects the very face of God. While this will be supremely true in the eternal joy and communion of the Saints in Heaven, it is already and irreversibly true even now. Christian faith, hope, and love, however, know that the face of God is disguised with the paradoxical appearance of the Crucified. Faith and love are the eyes of hope.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux and Saint Teresa of Calcutta both urge that we do small things for others with great love. Why? Because God is faithful and loses nothing of what is done for or given to him. Hope is living confidence in the truth of this. Christians grieve with hope, that is, they find blessing and consolation in their pain, sorrow, and loss, for these will pass away. That which is entrusted to God, which God takes to himself, endures for a future reunion of a surpassing joy. Christian patience is the practice of hope that endures, like love, all things. It experiences life standing shoulder to shoulder with the Risen Christ, yoked together with the Victor who still bears the marks of his crucifixion. Mercy, like planting seeds in springtime, is the practice of hope, for it looks beyond sin to the future and freedom offered by forgiveness, whereas accusation damns to the ashes of an unerasable past. Christian hope is already the certainty of the promised divine joy even though the darkness of the present cross is impenetrable to sight. It is the capacity to stand back up under the weight of the killing load and to trudge on toward Calvary although taunted by shame and failure in the face of death. The Letter to the Hebrews says that joy so moved the Lord as he carried the cross. It did so through hope.

Darkness, desolation, and depression assail the Christian. Doubt and despair threaten to eclipse the truth and love of God. By promise and presence the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit grasp us with an unshakable hold, experienced in faith, hope, and love. Jesus teaches us in his dying prayer how to abide in the grasp of the divine hands. Instead of complaint he surrendered to the silence of the Father. Instead of arguing he placed his will in the Father's will. Instead of accusation, he deferred to the Father's mercy. Instead of self-defense, he gave himself to the judgment of God. "Father, into your hands I entrust my spirit." This is the praying of hope which ensures victory in Christ over every foe. This is the prayer, even without words, which clasps a crucifix to the lips and speaks with a kiss.

May the Light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and times. Be of good hope. He is Risen and with us still. It is now ours to acknowledge and to welcome the crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ in the Easter Eucharist. Even as he made his presence known to the disciples in the breaking of the bread that first Easter evening, so he still does today. Receive him with faith, hope, and love. Even as he invited the disciples to touch his now risen wounds, so he still does through his Most Blessed Sacrament. As he touches us in his Sacrament so he gives himself to our touch and union. As he promised, he would never leave us orphaned. He has come back to us that we might always be with him.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a young boy, my parents told me about their wedding. Then a few years later, they showed me my mother's wedding dress and my dad's suit. It was astonishing to see and touch garments that connected me to the event that led to my existence. Of course, I already believed they were married based on their word. But these holy garments made the event real and tangible for me.

Something like this is at play when St. John reports encountering in Jesus' tomb, **"the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place" (John 20:7)**. Those two separate cloths, for his head and for his body respectively, meant a great deal to St. John and to the early Christians. Some years after the resurrection, there surfaced reports of two cloths with unusual characteristics, one bearing the image of a crucified man's body, another smaller one with the image of a wounded man's face. Some call them the Shroud of Turin and the Veil of Manoppello; they both can be seen today.

These two cloths have a long and complicated history, and scholars debate aspects of them. If you're curious, I encourage you to read about them. To be clear, I believe in the resurrection of Jesus because of the testimony of eyewitnesses and the gift of faith in the Church. Nevertheless, seeing these two mysterious cloths have made the life-giving event of Jesus' resurrection more real and tangible for me. Maybe they will for you, too.

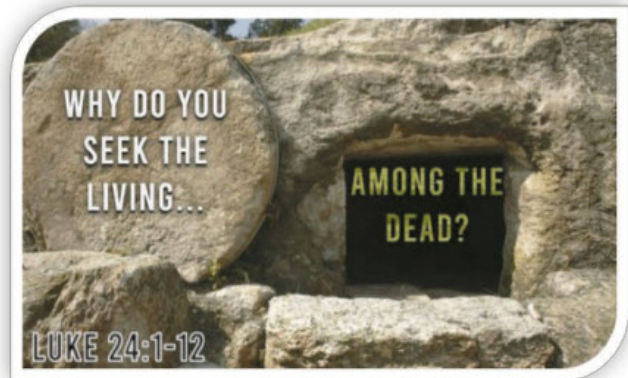

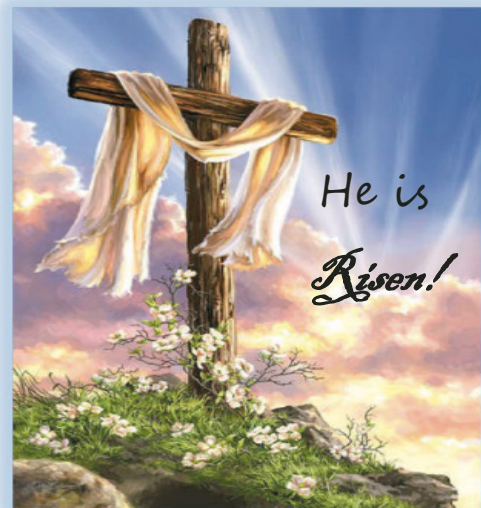

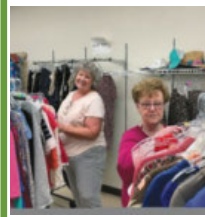

CHRISTIAN VOCATION

What is true of every Christian is the call or vocation to self-donating love after the example of Jesus Christ and in union with him. "It is not that we have loved God, but that God has loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins." Everyone who knows the love of God in Jesus Christ, knows the gift which God's love and mercy is. Here's the rule: "The gift you have received, make a gift of that." To this day, I do not know why God called me to make a gift of my life following Jesus and serving as a Catholic priest. I was attracted to marriage and family, as well as several possible careers. But from the first grade on I kept hearing that I might have a call to the priesthood. Eventually that possibility became a clear certainty and the path by which my life would be a gift of love. It is also always true that the symbol of Christian vocational love is the Crucifix. This is true for Marriage, the most abundant of the Christian vocations. It is likewise true for the ordained priesthood, for vowed Religious life, and for every chaste Christian single life. Each vocation is a call to self-donating love. With this in mind, help our children and youth to discern how they might make a gift of self to God and to humanity. Seeing with eyes of faith and hearing with ears which listen to the heart, know that God is definitely calling each one. In this life we may never know exactly the why of a particular vocation, but the fact of the call is simply true.
