What would Jesus, Mary & Joseph Do?

Not even 15 minutes after Mass, you find yourself sitting in the car, breaking up an argument between the kids who are fighting over where they get to sit or who gets in first. And you're thinking, what happened to the peace that we just offered one another during Mass? Are we crazy to think we can emulate the Holy Family when we can't even get out of the parish parking lot without fighting?

We look at the Nativity image and can almost hear the peaceful sounds of Silent Night and forget that Jesus, Mary and Joseph knew too well all of the struggles of earthly life. They would have encountered the same challenges, tribulations and misunderstandings that most families face today. We forget that the Holy Family would have attended gatherings, worked, shared meals, had fun, disagreed, loved, and lost. And they certainly wouldn't have

been immune to encountering gossip and the judgment of others. After all, our Blessed Mother was found with child out of wedlock!

Why *is* the Holy Family a model for Christian families and the domestic church, and how does one live out their vocation in the domestic church?

Jesus, Mary and Joseph's family life was based upon their faithfulness and obedience to God and how they accepted their God-given vocation.

Following their example, we can model those virtues of love and devotion of the Holy Family in many ways, such as:

- Accepting our family members for who they are, not who we want them to be;
- By forgiving and asking for forgiveness when we do wrong;
- By communicating with each other in which we put aside cell phones and tablets to make eye contact when speaking and by taking the time to listen in return

Likewise, when we are helping to bring one another closer to Christ by going to Mass and praying together, we are *honoring God's call* of faithfulness to Him.

Let us remember the family unit and pray for our human and spiritual families on this Feast of the Holy Family. And also take time to evaluate our own family lives and how we can improve.

Fr. Carl's Little Reservior...

On Friday evening, December 10, I was watching, like many of you, the weather maps on TV monitoring the severe weather hitting the Midwest. Of course, I had no way of knowing what was happening in nearby Edwardsville, or in Kentucky or Tennessee. In all three of those areas, lives were lost. These tornadoes bring back memories of the devastating tornado that struck Southeastern Illinois in the early morning hours of February 29, 2012, killing several people in Harrisburg, IL and completing destroying St. Joseph Catholic Church in Ridgway, IL. My sister Linda lives in Harrisburg, and my aunt Bernice (my mom's only sister) lives in Ridgway. A new church has been built in Ridgway, St. Kateri Tekawitha, which is now the parish not just for Ridgway, but for all of Gallatin County.

I find it curious that the name of the parish in Mayfield, Kentucky, which seemed to get the worst of the damage from the December 10 tornado, is also St. Joseph. I do not know if the church itself had any wind damage, but they are without water or electricity according to their website. Of course, they are reaching out to the local community that has lost so much, and probably having funerals for some of those who lost their lives. They are in the Diocese of Owensboro in Western Kentucky, which borders the southernmost part of our Diocese, and they have a strong Hispanic presence in their parish. If you would like to make a donation for their tornado relief efforts, I recommend you go to the website of the Diocese of Owensboro, KY, and click on "Tornado Relief."

The powerful forces of Mother Nature, whether it be tornadoes, hurricanes, forest fires, volcanos, earthquakes, floods, droughts or pandemics, keep us ever mindful that our destiny is always in the hands of God. St. Joseph, pray for us...

Save taxes on IRA Required Minimum Distributions...

Many Americans have taken advantage of tax incentives provided by Congress to encourage saving for retirement through contributions to Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs), 401(k)s and similar plans. In addition to income tax savings at the time contributions are made to such plans, the assets in the plans then build tax free over time for future enjoyment.

After age 70 1/2, when required minimum distributions (RMDs) can begin, up to \$100k/year from the IRA can be donated to charity tax free. (RMD's are not required now until age 72 if you were not $70 \frac{1}{2}$ by 12/31/2019.)

Tax deductions for charitable contributions have been impacted by higher standard deductions for federal tax. If you are going to donate to charity anyway, why not take advantage of this tax savings opportunity? Fr. Carl does it! 

Discipleship Corner...

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family which is often associated with the exile of the Holy Family to Egypt. Pope Francis has compared this exile to the plight of modern-day refugees who flee oppression and seek dignity. In 2013, the last legislative attempt for immigration reform in the United States failed to get Congressional approval. Eight years later, politicians on both sides of the aisle lament our immigration issues but take no legislative action. Let's call and let our legislators know we expect them to meet their responsibilities which surely include legislation to address the immigration issues we face.

Vocations Corner...

Today's Gospel tells of Jesus starting the work of His "vocation". He begins His teaching at the age of 12. Our vocation starts (maybe even earlier than age 12) as an indwelling, with the quiet whisper of God's pull on our heart. It's often personal and difficult to describe to others and often takes much prayer and discernment to see clearly. St. Francis de Sales reflected on this individual nature of our call, "We all have a vocation. We believe that God has placed us in this life to fill a special need that no one else can accomplish."


