Update On Covid Protocols

On February 24, we received updated Covid Protocols from the Diocese. Below is a summary of the items pertaining to us, plus some additional items from our parishes re-opening team.

Church Capacity and Masking

- ~ Beginning Ash Wednesday, March 1, masks will be optional at Mass and all liturgical celebrations.
- ~ Churches may be at 100% capacity If you would still like to social distance, there is seating behind the altar that you are welcome to use.

Celebration of the Liturgy

- ~Hymnals, votive candles and holy water may all be in use.
- ~ Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may assist with the distribution of Communion.

Ministers of Holy Communion are required to wear masks during the distribution of Communion and to sanitize hands (before and after distribution).

- ~Congregational singing, choirs and instrumentalists are allowed.
- ~Processions may resume and continue. (We will resume Offertory Processions and Altar Servers at Easter.)
- ~ The Sign of Peace: It will be the decision of individual worshipers as to how they will offer the sign of peace. There are various ways to extend sign of peace by gesture.
- ~ Holy Communion: For the foreseeable future, Holy Communion will remain only under the form of the consecrated HOST.

Communion on the tongue will be permitted, but it is recommended that those wishing to receive in this manner present themselves at the end of the Communion procession.

Sacraments

Funerals and Weddings

~ Follow same guidelines as Mass.

Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick

~ At this time, the use of cotton swabs or cotton balls for anointing should continue.

Reconciliation

~Face-to-face may continue.

Adoration chapel

~Adoration chapels may continue as normal. (Our adoration will continue to be on Tuesdays from 5-8 p.m. until further notice.)

Post-Celebration of Mass and Liturgies

- ~Sanitizing and Disinfecting
- ~It is no longer required to sanitize the church on a weekly basis. However, it is recommended that during flu and cold seasons, disinfecting high-traffic and high-touch surfaces resumes for a period of time.
- ~After every Mass (daily and weekly), it is still required that chalices and patens be washed with soap and water.

<u>Other</u>

Live-Streaming will be permanent at 5 p.m. Mass here at Immaculate Conception.

Park & Pray will continue until Bishop lifts the dispensation from obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

Pastoral/Nursing Home Visits -- Pastoral visits may resume with caution in cooperation with facility and county guidelines.

Funeral Lunches, Meetings, Social Events, Fish Frys, Parish Festivals -- Capacity may be 100% of area/building space.

- ~If serving food, food safety precautions must continue to be maintained per the local county health department.
- ~Staff and volunteers serving food are highly encouraged to wear masks and gloves.

The past two years have been an extremely challenging time for everyone – physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually. We have appreciated your patience, understanding and hard work as we navigated the waters of the unknown with the pandemic. We will continue to support you in your ministries and thank you for allowing us to accompany you.

The Season Of Lent

Lenten Regulations...



Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, and all Fridays in Lent. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to ones needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health and ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices. To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.




