The 2022 Catholic Service And Ministry Appeal... "Go & Do Likewise..."

If you are a member of the Diocese of Belleville, you have probably heard the term CSMA *many* times. The letters CSMA stand for Catholic Service and Ministry Appeal. Each year The Diocese kicks off a new campaign to raise funds for 17 agencies in our diocese under the CSMA. Those agencies are : Catholic Urban Programs, Daystar Community Program, Griffin Center, Respect Life Ministry, Office of Worship, Office of Hispanic Ministry, Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School, The Messenger, Seminarians/Vocations, Prison Ministry, Youth Ministry, Office of Grants/Communications, CSMA Fund for Ministry, Newman Catholic Student Center, Faith Formation/Education, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Belleville Council, and Bishop McGovern's Outreach.

These agencies work to accomplish many things and serve many people. The agencies that need the most help are the social outreach ministries ie. Holy Angels Shelter, Cosgrove's Kitchen & Cairo Daystar—all serving the poorest of the poor in our diocese. And many of you may not even know that **EVERY PENNY that is given goes straight to the 17 agencies. The diocese keeps none of the money.**

One catch phrase that is often used in CSMA campaign ads is "no gift is too small" and this is SO VERY true! Over the past couple of years, our country has experienced a pandemic, and rising inflation...both of which are widening the gap between the well off and the very poor. Now, more than ever, our gifts are needed to help people who need basic necessities, a hand up (not hand out), and quality programs to assist with everyday life situations that most of us take for granted. Since the CSMA supports agencies in the diocese that help the poorest of the poor, even the smallest amount that you give will make a huge difference in someone's life.

We are the largest parish in the diocese of Belleville, can you imagine what we could do if we all pledged to give what we could no matter how small??? Together we have the ability to help SO MANY!!

This year we have set a parishioner participation goal of 250 people. We have already achieved 42% of that goal. For the past two years, by focusing on just participation we have exceeded our monetary goal set by the Diocese. I ask you to consider giving to this very worthy cause. Not for me ,Father Carl, Fr. Nick or Bishop McGovern, .but for the people it serves. **WE** have an opportunity to change lives!

Lent is a time to renew our commitment to almsgiving. This March 17 statement from the U. S. Catholic Bishops is a powerful reminder that almsgiving should include sharing our homeland with the poor, the war -torn and the stranger, who are the face of Christ present in our midst today.

THE DIOCESE OF BELLEVILLE

March 19, 2022

Dear Friends,

Two years ago, when there was great uncertainty about the spread of the coronavirus, many bishops dispensed the faithful in their dioceses from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass as a temporary means for promoting the health, safety and wellbeing of everyone. My predecessor, Bishop Edward Braxton, dispensed the faithful from this obligation in the Diocese of Belleville in March 2020.

Now twenty-four months later, as our society and the Church have taken many measures to promote the health of the public, we have reached a point where we believe that we can reintroduce the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in a way that balances our health and safety concerns with the deep desire to meet the Lord Jesus and our sisters and brothers during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist in our churches, chapels and institutions.

<u>Therefore</u>, on <u>Sunday April 10</u>, <u>Palm Sunday</u>, I will lift the dispensation and reintroduce the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for our Catholic community in southern Illinois. For many people who have continued to participate at Mass via social communication, I encourage you to see this step as an invitation to return to our parishes as we begin Holy Week. How fitting it is that we should gather around the altar of the Lord in church as we celebrate the mysteries of our salvation in Christ.

For those who are sick, homebound, or gravely concerned about their health, the dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass remains, as it has in the past during normal times. No one is morally obligated to attend Mass when doing so presents a grave risk to their health or the health of others.

Please share this information with your family members and friends; I hope this is a moment when we can each offer a personal invitation to our families and neighbors to re-engage in the Eucharist at our parishes. When Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper in Jerusalem two thousand years ago, he declared to his apostles: "Do this in memory of me." May the Lord's words resonate in our hearts as we move toward the holiest of weeks and our celebration of the saving mysteries of Christ.

The Season Of Lent

Lenten Regulations...

Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, and



all Fridays in Lent. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. The other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to ones needs, but altogether they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health and ability to work would be seriously affected, the obligation of the law is modified. Because Lent is a special season for all Christians, we should not lightly excuse ourselves from these penitential practices. To completely disregard the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
