Letting God Rise Back Up In Us...

During Lent, one of the cornerstones that we try to make available as much as possible is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As someone who has felt some of the deepest connections to God on both sides of the sacrament, both as confessor and penitent, I want to just share some thoughts about the gift of God's mercy in this way.

As Catholics, we often find ourselves with a very sober understanding of sin and mistakes that we make. We understand and emphasize how our sins affect ourselves, affect others, and affected Jesus on the Cross.

I do not intend to water down the severity or importance of taking sin seriously. I do however, want us to be aware that there is something *worse* than sin and that is what happens *after* we sin. Sin is bad, sure, but the temptation to go to extreme senses of guilt or shame or self-hatred after we sin is much worse. It is a much more sinister place to be. After we sin or make mistakes, we can want to run and hide, and never try to stand tall or get back to where we were in life. Like Adam and Eve, there is that sense of shame and wanting to hide from God, all the while saying that God is hard for us to find.

The most important thing we can do when we fall is to stand up again. Confession is that act of standing up after

we fall down. Often, we hide from it or delay it because we're too afraid to face the past and deal with it as it is. This is totally understandable but know that the enemy wants us to stay in this retreated position for as long as possible. It takes courage and grace and humility to allow God to enter into your past in this Sacrament. That's why I always have the utmost respect for anyone who chooses to come, in spite of fear or doubt or any obstacle in the way. I see anyone in confession as a saint in the making! If it has been a while since your last Reconciliation, I would encourage you to go this Lent. Know that Christ who fell and rose 3 times on the way to Calvary, will rise again in you if you let Him!

Lent is a time to renew our commitment to almsgiving. This March 17 statement from the U.S. Catholic Bishops is a powerful reminder that almsgiving should include sharing our homeland with the poor, the war-torn and the stranger, who are the face of Christ present in our midst today.

The committee's full statement follows:

The issues of refugees, migration, and forced displacement of people are not new ones, and there are many countries facing these challenges. Across the globe, families have been forced to flee their homes in search of safety and security. War, violence, racial strife, corruption and political instability, natural disasters, and poverty: these all still remain major factors in the lives of so many, which is why the numbers of people on the move, refugees, and people being displaced are at historically high levels.

As Christians, the words of Jesus must always shape how we think and how we act. The Apostle Paul emphasizes this when writing to the Philippians: Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus (2:5).

Some may question why and how the Church supports refugees and migrants, regardless of race, creed, or color, but the simple truth is that Christ identifies with those in need: For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me (Mt 25:35).

This means that when people are hungry and knock at our door, we feed them. When they come to our door cold,

we clothe them. And when someone who is a stranger comes, we welcome him or her. The Church does this everywhere she exists. We do this because this is what Christ calls us to do. In the United States, much of the Church's care for and ministry to refugees and migrants can be seen in the longstanding dedication and hard work of our Catholic Charities agencies.

The Conference has spoken time and again about the call to welcome and protect the newcomer. What is clearly true, and what the Church and many others have called for, is the urgent need for a comprehensive reform of our country's immigration system. The U.S. immigration system is overly complex and unjust, often keeping family members apart; it must be fixed. The Church does teach that a country has the right to regulate its borders. At the same time, people have the fundamental right to migrate in order to preserve their lives and families.

What must always be in the forefront of our thoughts and actions is the fact that each and every person, including the newcomer, is a brother or sister to us all and a blessing to welcoming communities when given the opportunity to integrate. We must acknowledge not only the inherent dignity of immigrants but also embrace their contributions and potential.

Sisters and brothers in Christ, let us embrace the ministry given to us by Jesus and reject the contemporary forces of division that tempt us with a false choice between our security and our humanity. Our great nation is capable of safeguarding both our humanity and our security.
