Fr. Carl's Little Reservoir...

It was on June 19, 1955, that I made my First Communion at St. Mary's Church in Old Shawneetown, IL. My memories are many: 1) All the boys and girls wore all white suits and white dresses, and my biggest challenge was to keep that white suit clean until I got to church: 2) We had to fast for three hours (or maybe it was after Midnight) before Communion, which was no easy challenge either; and 3) We all knelt down at the Communion Rail to receive our First Holy Communion from our pastor, Fr. John O'Keefe, reciting both pre-Communion prayers and post-Communion prayers in unison from our Magnificat prayer books while the Mass continued in Latin. I suspect some of you

have similar memories. This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Easter, 59 children from our parish will be receiving their First Holy Communion at a special Mass at 1:30 pm. Unlike in my day, the Ordo of the Church now recommends that First Communion be celebrated on one of the Sundays (2nd – 6th) of the Easter Season. Also, in my day, there was no reception of the Blood of Christ, which has become the custom since 1979, though that has been temporarily discontinued due to COVID-19 restrictions. And even though all of the 2nd graders will be dressed up in their Sunday best today, there is no requirement that everyone wear white suits or white dresses with veils, although some still do. And of course the pre-Communion fast is now only one hour. But regardless of when or how we made our First Holy Communion, the essence is still the same. It is a glorious day to celebrate and to remember as we receive for the very first time the Bread of Life, the Body of Christ. It's a meal I never want to miss! --Fr. Carl


