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#### **ACTIVITIES**

<u>CARD PLAYING</u> - Playing Cards is one of the most popular activities at the Center. Monday and Friday afternoons you will find the BRIDGE players. On the 1st and 3rd Wednesday afternoons, DUPLICATE BRIDGE is played. Show up at 10:00 a.m. Thursday mornings if CRIBBAGE is your game. 500 is played on Friday afternoon. For more information on how to get involved with the card groups, call us at the Center 341-5923. If you are interested in starting other card games or games to play, there is always room for more.

<u>POTLUCKS</u> - The Center's monthly Potluck dinners are held the third Thursday of each month. A get together with friends and family. Entertainment at 4:00pm and dinner at 5:00pm. There are no potlucks in September (Open House Picnic), and December (Christmas Party).

<u>CRAFT & GIFT CORNER</u> - The Center has an ongoing sale of craft items from local crafters. The Center receives 15% of all sales. Some items are donated to the Center then 100% goes to the Center. All proceeds go into the General Fund to help with the operation and maintenance of the Center. If you are interested in donating items, please feel free to call us or drop them off. If you are interested in placing items in the sale, we will be happy to set you up with the information.

<u>TUESDAY BINGO</u> - Every Tuesday afternoon the Center operates a State regulated Bingo. Bingo is open to the public. You must be 18 years of age or older to play. Sales start at 12:30 (after the noon meal) and play starts at 1:30, and over about 4:00 p.m.

<u>CREATIVE WRITING GROUP</u> - If you like to write, this is the group for you. They meet the last Monday of each month at 4:00 p.m. at the Senior Center. With the direction of Betty LaPointe, the group has had their 10th publication done of some of their memories they have put on paper. They welcome new writers to come join them.

<u>ANNUAL CHRISTMAS PARTY</u> - This event is usually held the 2nd Thursday of December. It's a fun night for all, with entertainment, dinner, gifts, and a visit from Santa.

<u>BUS TRIPS</u> - Several trips are arranged through the Center annually, such as the Country Music Show in Munising, Casino Adventures, the Escanaba State Fair, Color Tour Trips, Senior Convention, visits to other Senior Centers, Bingo Trips, and anything else we can make arrangements for and get enough to participate. <u>LONG DISTANCE BUS TRIPS</u> - For the past few years bus trips have been arranged through *Diamond Tours*. We have had great participation and hope to continue to plan another.

#### HOW OLD DO I HAVE TO BE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR SERVICES AT THE SENIOR CENTER?

Seniors 60 years of age and over may be eligible for services. Seniors 55 and older can enjoy the Center and its social activities.

#### **SERVICES**

<u>Information and Referral</u> - This service provides seniors with information as to what source can best help with solving or answering their questions or problems. Many questions and problems are handled by the staff at the Center. If you are looking for your law makers phone numbers, where to get a wheelchair, the Social Security Office, free legal advice, dates of distribution of food commodities or any unanswered questions, just give us a call at 341-5923 and we will do our best to help.

<u>Medical Transportation</u> - We are able to provide long distance transportation runs for medical appointments to out-lying areas, such as, Escanaba, Marquette, Iron Mountain, Newberry, etc. Rides must be arranged through the Center and given as much advance notice as possible to make the arrangements. The fee is by donation, which goes back into the program to provide more rides.

<u>Outreach Services</u> - If you are unable to come to the Center, we will try to make arrangements to come to you when ever possible. We do this on a limited basis, as we do not have the staff to be out of the Center for long periods of time. We will do your taxes, help with paying your bills, letter writing, balancing your checkbook or whatever the situation may be. If we are unable to come to you we will make arrangements to take care of your questions or problems.

Homemaker Aide Services - This is our housekeeping service that helps seniors maintain their home. Duties can include sweeping, dusting, dishes, bed making, cleaning bathroom, mopping, vacuuming, general house keeping tasks. We encourage seniors to do whatever tasks they can to maintain their home and let us do the things they can't. Scheduling is done in advance by the Center staff so that seniors using the service will know dates and times the aide will be at their home. Seniors must be home at the time of service, and should let us know in advance if they need to cancel for any reason. Sometimes we are able to reschedule. This service is provided on a donation basis. All donations go back into the program.

<u>Weekly Column</u> - Each week in the Manistique Pioneer Tribune a column is written about events and activities at the Senior Center. Check for events, cards, memorials, birthdays and other information each week.

<u>Balance Checkbook and Bill Paying</u> - We will assist Seniors with balancing their checkbook and help set up an appointment if you need help.

**Phone Numbers & Addresses of Current Elected Officials An updated list is kept at the Center for your information.** 

<u>Copies</u>—The Center's Office staff will make copies for seniors. The cost is .25 cents a copy.

#### Homestead Property Taxes and Home Heating Credits

These forms are filled out county wide for all eligible seniors. It consists of a refund on your property tax or rent and a credit on your home heating costs. Listed below is the information needed to complete these forms:

- 1. Social Security Number (s)
- 2. Copy of previous year return (if possible).
- 3. Income-including social security, pension, SSI, and any interest.
- 4. Property Taxes or rent paid.
- 5. Medical Insurance Premiums.
- 6. Heating costs (billed 11/1/20 thru 10/31/21).
- 7. Copy of 1099 from Social Security or a bank statement from the Dept. of Human Services (DHHS) Form SA1099.
- 8. Telephone number where you can be reached.
- 9. If renting, name and address of landlord.

Under 60 years of age call Community Action Agency. at 341-2452.

<u>Center's Bulletin Boards</u> - A bulletin board is located at the front door of the Center where we post all kinds of information. We also encourage the seniors to use the bulletin board if they are selling something or belong to an organization that is holding an event. We have added a second board where we post upcoming activities.

<u>Senior Project Fresh</u> - This program provides coupons for the purchase of fresh, nutritious, unprepared, fruits and vegetables from authorized farmers markets and roadside stands to individuals age 60 years or older with gross incomes at or below 185% of the poverty level. \$20.00 worth of coupons are given out on a first come basis during the period of June 1 through September 30. Call the Senior Center for coupons, at 341-5923

<u>Health Related</u> - Any health-related service that we can help provide is scheduled as often as possible through the Center and at the nutrition sites. In the fall of each year we schedule a health agency to provide flu shots. We also provide as often as possible blood pressure checks, cholesterol testing, blood sugar testing, and health screening when available through the local health agencies.

Educational Classes and Speakers - We provide as many speakers and classes that we can, that we feel will be of interest to seniors. The purpose is to keep you informed and updated on changes on such subjects as Social Security, Medicare, Local/County Government issues, health-related issues, AARP driving classes. We have also been able to provide classes on wills and estate planning, living wills and prescription drugs. We are always open to suggestions and always on the lookout for new and interesting speakers or classes. If you have a topic of interest, please let us know.

Medical Loan Closet - The loan closet is located at the Manistique Senior Center. We have numerous items available, such as, wheelchairs, commodes, walkers, quad canes, regular canes, bath chairs, bath benches, and crutches, etc. A \$5.00 donation for 6 months is suggested. If equipment is still being used at the end of 6 months, it can be renewed for another 6 months at the \$5.00 fee. We also have a supply of adult protection briefs, and occasionally we have a supply of blue pads. Anyone having equipment in good condition and is no longer being used, please consider donating it to the Loan Closet here at the Center.

<u>Blood Pressure Clinic</u> - Fridays 11:30 - 12:30 by Schoolcraft Memorial Homecare.

<u>Hearing Aid Services</u> - This service is provided once a month by Northern Michigan Hearing Service of Marquette. For appointment please call 1-800-637-7816. Batteries are available at the Senior Center Office.

<u>Birthday Cards</u> - Birthday Cards are sent from the Center to registered member seniors that are 80 and older.

<u>Building Use & Rentals</u> - Building can be rented for private use, such as, baby showers, birthday parties, wedding showers, group meetings, reunions, etc. Rent is \$40 plus a \$25 key deposit, and a \$25 cleaning deposit. Deposits are refunded when key is returned and building is in condition you started with.

<u>Feeding America</u> - Once a month Feeding America truck is sponsored by different organizations, such as Good Neighbors, Schoolcraft Memorial Hospital, and others, to help those that need assistance in making ends meet. This service will continue until money runs out.

<u>Timepiece Newsletter—</u> This is our monthly newsletter. What's going on at the Center, calendar of events, recipes, jokes, helpful hints, etc. We encourage seniors to write articles or share stories they may have. We include as much as we can. The cost of the subscription is \$10.00 per year.

Noon Meal Nutrition Program - Meals are served and prepared by the Community Action Agency Staff. Meals are for anyone 60 years of age or older for a donation of \$3.00, under the age of 60 is \$5.00. The menu is published weekly in the Advisor and the Pioneer Tribune. Monday thru Friday at 12 noon. Call 341-5085 at least the day before to register.

<u>Home Delivered Meals</u> - Contact the CAA Nutrition Kitchen at 341-5085 (located at the Manistique Senior Center) for more information on home delivered and frozen meals.

<u>Telephone Reassurances</u> - This is done by request. Calls are made beginning at 9:00 am to give a cheery "Good Morning" and to make sure you are okay. The only information we need is your phone number, address, and a contact person. We do ask that if you are not going to be home that you let us know. If you do not answer, we call the contact or police check.

<u>Filling Out Forms</u> - If you have forms that need to be filled out and you need help, bring them in. If we can't fill them out we will find out how or find someone who can.

Footcare Clinic - (Toenail clipping) This clinic is scheduled the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month from 1-3 p.m. By North Woods Home Nursing & Hospice. The fee is \$22.00 and appointments are made by calling the Senior Center 341-5923. Please bring your own towel.


