

SOCIAL CONCERNS NOTES – PULASKI FOOD PANTRY




The Pulaski Community Food Pantry is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, run through the PACE office and supervised by a board comprised of community members.

The patrons of the Pulaski Pantry must reside in the Pulaski School District and meet income requirements based on the federal poverty guidelines. The number of patrons using the Pantry varies from month to month, ranging from about 40 to 65.

As a non-profit, the Pulaski Pantry relies completely on donations. It is supported by food drives organized by each of the Pulaski schools, 13 area churches, and the Boy Scout and the Mail Carrier food drives, as well as monetary donations from local businesses and community members. This support helps to stock the Pantry's shelves with food, hygiene, cleaning, and paper products.

Some other services provided by the Pantry include a Back to School Store, a Wrapped in Warmth program to provide winter clothing for local children, and a Christmas Gifts for Kids and Seniors program which served 143 children and 24 senior citizens this past Christmas.

Meet your Flintville Neighbor.....

Look who you are sure to meet at 10:00 a.m. Mass on Sundays. While during the peak of COVID, you might have found her on Tuesdays at the weekday Mass, "I knew it would be less congested, so I made Tuesday my Sundays; I did not like virtual Mass without taking in the Eucharist."

Helen Maki, wife, mother, widow, and grandmother now lives quite independently, and what a strong soul I found her to be. She is one of five children, growing up in Montreal, Wisconsin: a small mining town. Gordon (her late husband) and herself went to the same high school. They married in 1965, and had 3 children: Cheryl, Lynn, and Doug. She was married for 51 years when Gordon passed of medical problems. "He has been gone for 5 years already," she says with a sigh.



She spoke kindly of caring for her husband before his death, and of raising their daughter, Cheryl, who is now 55 years old, disabled, and lives nearby in a CBRF (Community Based Residential Facility). She speaks proudly of her two other children, Lynn and Doug. She worked as a Medical Technologist at St. Vincent Hospital for 16 years and then for the Red Cross for 16 years. "Raising kids and working is a rewarding life but busy, you know, you just keep going," she said.

She talked about the changes at Ss. Edward & Isidore since 1973, after going through 4 priests; Father Bob, Father Hank, Father Dave, and now young Father Dave. She said, "In the good old days, the church was such a community—families met and had dances, baby showers, gatherings to rent the hall, the place where all my friends met. I miss that, but insurance and liability and Covid made many changes on how we get together. Now the entrance of the church is where I do most of the visiting."

Helen is always working to improve herself; she tells me she reviews the Spiritual and Corporal works of Mercy, "to see if I am on the right course-you need to get better as you get older and we all change over the years." She is involved in Care Ministry and visits parishioners and brings communion. She likes to read the New Testament and her favorite passage is LUKE 2:29, "Now, Master, you can dismiss your servant in peace; you have fulfilled your word." We talked about picking out songs at funerals and how important music is in the service.

The "Flintville Flowers" is a group of women she has kept close to over the years. They play cards and meet socially at each other's homes. She is proud to say they have kept it alive with vaccinations and boosters and "having extra room at the table." So, if you go to 10:00 a.m. Mass, stop Helen in the Narthex and say hello! She says, "I am usually the last to leave, I like to talk!"




