Ss. Edward and Isidore Finance Council Meeting (Virtual Meeting) February 16, 2022

Present: Katy Karcz, Craig Maternoski, Donna Sheedy, Claire Tauscher, Shirley Havlik, Father Dave, and Sheri Mastalish **Absent**: Terry Brockman and Steve Rickert

The meeting was called to order by Donna Sheedy and Father Dave led us in prayer.

Shirley Havlik was welcomed as a new member of the Finance Council replacing Jody Zepnick who resigned in October 2021 due to other commitments.

The minutes of the regular meeting on January 19, 2022 were reviewed and approved.

The bills and financial reports for January 2022 were reviewed and approved. Receipts and disbursements were as follows:

The cemetery reports for January 2022 were reviewed and approved.

Sheri updated the Council on the Stewardship Projects. We have collected and on February 15 paid the \$5,000 grant to Laundry Love – Green Bay, which exists to help alleviate issues that poor health and hygiene places on needy members of our community by providing quarters, laundry soap, and dryer sheets through Laundry Love events at a local laundromat. We have collected \$370 toward the second \$3,000 portion of the overall \$6,000 grant to Friends of Pals, Youth & Families, Inc. in Green Bay for basic needs and a group activity in 2022. This non-profit organization links caring adult volunteer mentors with children involved with Child Protective Services to provide role modeling and long-term friendships. The current balance available to purchase items that will be used in the Haiti Kits, which our parish puts together for teenage girls and infants as part of a project undertaken by Friends of Haiti, remains at \$1,125. The Finance Council decided that starting January 1, 2020, the Stewardship of Giving for "Our Own Parish Needs" from the first and third weekends will be used for ongoing maintenance projects. The account has a balance of \$29,087 (after payment of \$38,403 to IEI General Contractors in December 2021 for replacement of the church windows above the altar and repair damaged areas caused by old roof leaks).

Sheri reported on the receipts for recent special collections. The Retirement Fund for Religious special collection, which began on December 18-19, has yielded \$3,310 through February 15 compared with \$1,430 in 2020 and \$4,674 in 2019. The Diocese requires transmittal of the special collection funds collected within 60 days of the scheduled collection date, so the \$3,310 was paid on January 26.

The final results of the 2021 Bishop's Appeal were reviewed. A total of 459 families pledged \$123,818.11 to help us reach our 2021 Bishop's Appeal target of \$129,771, including \$55,890 from 83 Crozier families (those contributing \$500 or more). As required by the Diocese, the remaining 2021 balance of \$5,952.89 was paid out of the parish's operating funds on January 26, 2022.

Sheri reported that an additional designated \$12 was received for the Christmas collection bringing the total received for 2021 to \$48,277.24. Individual checks to the causes selected were issued on February 1 totaling \$37,520 and \$10,757.24 was Unrestricted Contributions – Church Support, which was added to the maintenance fund on January 28. That increased the balance in that account to \$29,087.41.

The Green Bay Diocese has set the 2022 Bishop's Appeal goal for our parish at \$130,633, which is \$720 more than our goal for 2021. To kick off this year's Appeal, we listened to a taped message from Bishop Ricken on February 5 and 6. Terry Brockman then spoke at all Masses on February 12 and 13 and provided information from our parish's perspective. Terry did an excellent job! Thus far (through February 15), 22 families have pledged \$14,920 to help us reach our 2022 Bishop's Appeal target. Of the total pledged, \$13,440 was from 17 Crozier families (those contributing \$500 or more).

The budget process for 2022-2023 began in January. Letters of intent regarding continuing employment were sent out to parish staff for signature as appropriate. A letter was sent to parish staff members seeking their input and that of the appropriate committees regarding projected expenses for their areas. Data must be returned to Sheri Mastalish by Monday, March 7. Staff members will be invited to meet individually with the Finance Council (without Father Dave or Sheri present) if interested at the March 16 Finance Council meeting.

The Maintenance and Safety Committee's activities/projects were discussed. Sheri Mastalish reported that the committee last met on February 8. As the parish looks at the landscaping around the church which is a project for spring, it's important that design is part of the process. For budget and planning purposes, a quote was received for painting the floor in church and staining the tops of the pews.

After discussion, the Finance Council completed the Long-Range Planning Committee's survey with respect to the spiritual needs of the parish. Any additional thoughts can be emailed to Sheri.

The Discipleship Committee (formed in December with members of the former Stewardship, Evangelization, and Welcoming Committees) was held on February 9. The group discussed which activities will continue and which activities would be good fits for the future. Former favorites to continue include Easter giveaways, the booth for evangelization at Harvest Fest in August, Elder event (flu shots, Mass of Anointing, and meal for those aged 75+) in the fall, and craft show in the fall. New items include a graduation Mass, concert in church, and game night.

Future meetings of the Finance Council will be a combination of in-person meetings and via Zoom as necessary.

The next meeting of the Finance Council has been scheduled for March 16, at 6:00 p.m. Potential future meetings are tentatively scheduled for 6:00 p.m. on April 27, May 18, August 24 or 31 (due to Harvest Fest, so check calendars regarding vacations), September 21, October 19, November 16, and December 21.


Walk to Mary, May 7, 2022
