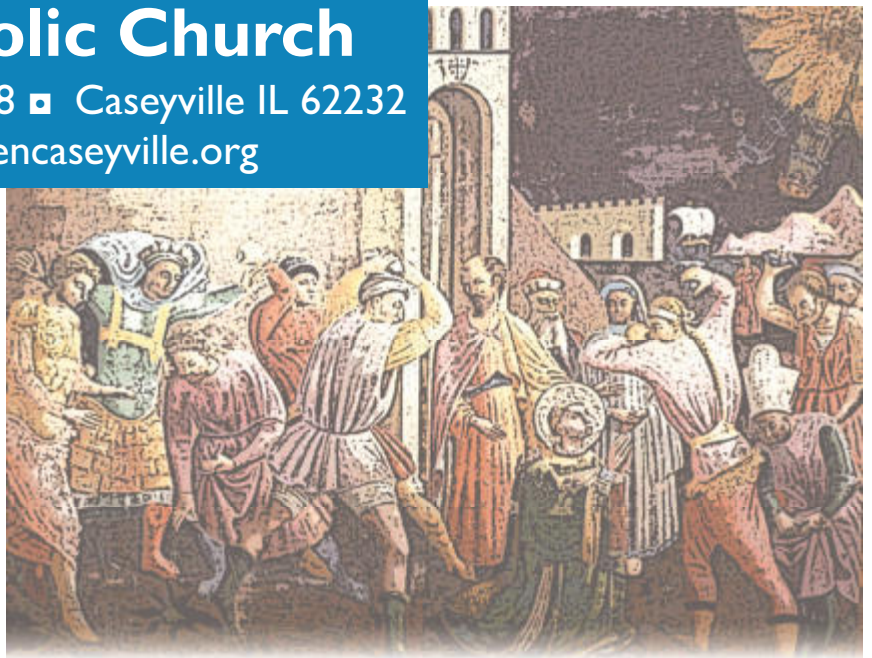

From Fr. John...

I can always tell the moments in the year when I get busy, because things like writing a few personal comments for the bulletin tend to fall out of my schedule. It has been a few weeks since I have written to you, so I have a few things to catch up on.

*First, please spend a little time with the insert that you will find in the bulletin today to mark the **Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ**. Recent surveys have found that many Catholics lack an understanding of what we mean when we talk about the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is a central mystery of our faith, so please take just a moment to be sure you understand what the Church teaches about why and how Jesus comes to us in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood.*

*You will notice a new face at Mass today – **Mr. Robert Donaldson**. He goes by “Robby.” Robby is a seminarian for the Diocese of Belleville. He is a student at Sacred Heart School of Theology in Hales Corners, WI. Robby will be with us at St. Stephen through the summer. You will see him at daily and Sunday Mass and he will help around the parish in several ways, so that we can benefit from his work and he can get some practical experience in parish ministry. I will ask Robby to introduce himself in the bulletin next week. Please make him welcome in our parish.*

*As I announced at Mass last week, the Diocesan Reopening Committee, Bishop McGovern, and I are asking everyone who comes to Mass to continue wearing a mask, distancing, registering or providing contact information, and sanitizing our hands frequently. We expect these practices to continue until the State of Illinois announces that we are in Phase 5 of the Restore Illinois Plan. We have adopted some changes. For example, we can have more people in church; up to about 250 people (as long as we can stay appropriately distanced). We will also begin training Mass servers again very soon. Please put September 10th, 11th, and 12th on your calendars. Those are the dates of the upcoming **parish festival**. Much more to come in future bulletins.*

You may notice a couple of projects happening around the parish. Volunteers will be burying drainage pipe to redirect the water that sump pumps remove from the basements of the rectory and church. There is essentially a large, rock-filled dry-well under and around the road that runs between the rectory/church and the soccer fields. We are going to redirect the sump to pump water into that deep layer of rock so that it can dissipate. We will watch the area, and if we see any sign that the drainage is eroding the road, we will pump it further out. If it works, this solution will save us a much more significant expenditure.

Volunteers will also be working to install additional sump pumps in the church basement and correct some very typical safety issues that were identified in a recent insurance inspection. We are also getting bids from roofers on some patching that needs to happen in places along the edges of the roof on the church and rectory.

Finally, you may have heard that Fr. Jim Nall will be moving out of the St. Stephen rectory over the summer. Holy Trinity Parish recognized that they would need to pay St. Stephen Parish some rent if Fr. Nall lived in our rectory. They chose to purchase a home for their pastor instead. I had not yet asked for rent from Holy Trinity, and nothing has been received, but we were just beginning to begin that conversation when I learned that they had decided to purchase a home. St. Stephen remains in partnership not only with Holy Trinity, but also with Holy Rosary in Fairmount City.
