29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners in Christ,

Fun: Two pastors were lamenting how small a voice they had in the community compared to the wealthy members.

“Money talks,” said the first pastor. “True,” said the second pastor, “and the only thing my money says is ‘goodbye.’”

This week we see that Jesus’ answer to the Pharisees and the Herodians that we should give what belongs to Caesar to Caesar and what belongs to God to God, he called on all Christians to respect constituted authority for the common good. Two images are before us: that of Caesar and that of God. To the first image, Jesus asks a simple question: “Whose picture is on the coin?” And the answer is simple, “Caesar.” Therefore, give to Caesar what belongs to him, that is the part of your possession that belongs to him. But Jesus also has a second, penetrating question: Whose image and blessing is on every human being? And the answer is simple, “God’s.” Therefore, give to God what belongs to him, that is your entire being, whole and undivided. If the image of Caesar was stamped on Roman coins that were to be rendered to him, the human heart bears the imprint of the Creator, the one Lord of our life. He has marked us for his own and sent us on a mission to the world. Do our human projects make us better prophets, servants and agents of the Kingdom of Jesus? Let us never be ashamed of working publicly for Jesus’ kingdom, and telling people about Him. He alone guarantees us authentic joy and deep hope, for all the people in our time.” His kingdom will have no end.

In conclusion, let us pray this week for the courage and wisdom to give simple and truthful answers when we find ourselves in ambiguous and compromising situations. We are marked and blessed with God’s image. Let us never forget to whom we really belong, and why we really do the things we do. We are not called for ourselves, but we are summoned by the Lord and sent to the world, to proclaim His name and His saving works. It is a daunting mission. But it is also a cause for rejoicing.

GOSPEL QUESTION OF THE

WEEK: How much responsibility do you feel the government should take for meeting the needs of the less fortunate in our society? How willing are you to contribute?


The opponents of Jesus, the Pharisees and Herodians (supporters of Herod’s dynasty), join forces to trap Jesus. If Jesus affirms that taxes should be paid, he alienates the religious nationalists; if he denies that taxes should be paid, then he is subject to arrest by the Romans as a political revolutionary. But the very fact that his inquisitors could produce the emperor’s coin from one of their purses was to admit a

Roman obligation. If one used the sovereign’s coin then one automatically took on an obligation to the sovereign, in other words, the Pharisees and Herodians, in trying to trap Jesus, answered their own question. But Jesus takes the debate to an even higher level by challenging them to be just as observant in paying their debts to God. The confrontation over Caesar’s coin is not a solution to any church-versus-state controversy; Jesus’ response to the Pharisees confronts them—and us—with the demand to act out of our convictions and to take responsibility for our actions. While we yearn for easy answers to complicated questions and “soundbite” solutions to complex problems, the real purpose and meaning of life are found in the intricacies of our conscious and the things we believe in the depth of our hearts. The Pharisees who confront Jesus are trying to trap him into making a choice between one’s country and God. But Jesus’ response indicates that one’s citizenship does not have to be at odds with one’s faith, in fact, when government seeks to provide for the just welfare of its citizens, it is doing the “things” of God. The Preamble to our nation’s Constitution reads more like a covenant we Americans have made with one another than a legal outline of how our government will operate. Although God is not mentioned at all, we can sense His Spirit in the Preamble: “We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty for ourselves and our posterity...” To strike that balance between the things of Caesar’s and the things of God demand that we participate in the affairs of government responsibly and intelligently, in order that our public policies reflect the wisdom and justice of our God. This is a good time to talk to your kids about being responsible citizens and contributing to the wellbeing of others. Talk about these things and then ask them:

Who needs help in your neighborhood or community?
What could you and your family do to help?

21 Faith—what is it?

Faith is knowledge and trust. It has seven characteristics:

- Faith is a sheer gift of God, which we receive when we fervently ask for it.
- Faith is the supernatural power that is absolutely necessary if we are to attain salvation.
- Faith requires the free will and clear understanding of a person when he accepts the divine invitation.
- Faith is absolutely certain, because Jesus guarantees it.
- Faith is incomplete unless it leads to active love.
- Faith grows when we listen more and more carefully to God's Word and enter a lively exchange with him in prayer.
- Faith gives us even now a foretaste of the joy of heaven.

Many people say that to believe is not enough for them; they want to know. The word "believe", however, has two completely different meanings. If a parachutist asks the clerk at the airport, "Is the parachute packed safely?" and the other man answers casually, "Hmm, I believe so", then that will not be enough for him; he would like to know it for sure. But if he has asked a friend to pack the parachute, then the friend will answer the same question by saying, "Yes, I did it personally. You can trust me!" And to that the parachutist will reply, "Yes, I believe you." This belief is much more than knowing; it means assurance. And that is the kind of belief that prompted Abraham to travel to the Promised Land; that is the faith that caused the martyrs to stand fast till death; that is the faith that still today upholds Christians in persecution. A faith that encompasses the whole person.

Diocesan policy: Report and inform

The Diocese of Evansville has in place a policy that requires that any allegation of child abuse must be reported to civil authorities. If an allegation involves the sexual abuse of a minor by diocesan personnel, the Victims Assistance Coordinator must also be informed.

Sexual misconduct violates human dignity and the mission of the church. The spiritual well-being of all victims, their families, and others in the community is of particular concern to the church.
