



Dear Parishioners in Christ,

Fun: A priest went into a second-grade classroom of the parish school and asked, "Who can tell me what the Blessed Trinity means?" A little girl lisped, "The Blethed Twinity meanth there are three perthonth in one God." The priest, taken aback by the lisp, said, "Would you say that again? I don't understand what you said." The little girl answered, "Y'not supposed to underthtand; 't'rh a myhtewy."

This week we celebrate the feast of Holy Trinity. It is very difficult to give many explanations to understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity but a good illustration of the Trinity comes from world-renowned scientist Dr. Henry Morris. He notes that the entire universe is Trinitarian by design. The universe consists of three things: matter, space, and time. Take away any one of those three and the universe would cease to exist. But each one of those is itself a trinity.

Matter = mass + energy + motion

Space = length + height + breadth

Time = past + present + future

According to a legend, St Patrick, the missionary patron saint of Ireland, used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. The story goes that one day his friends asked Patrick to explain the mystery of the Trinity. He looked at the ground and saw shamrocks growing amongst the grass at his feet. He picked one up and showed it to his friends, saying "Look at this beautiful little shamrock. Do you think it has one leaf or three?" Patrick's friends couldn't answer the shamrock looked like one leaf but it clearly had three parts. Patrick reassured them, "The mystery of this shamrock is like the mystery of the Trinity; there are three parts but they are all part of one." Christians around the world continue to puzzle about the mystery of the Holy Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit - one God but three different ways of knowing about God. They use symbols based on the triangle pattern or plants like the shamrock to help them with this kind of 'three-in-one thinking'.

PARENTAL PONDERING

for

May 30—Trinity Sunday

(Year B)

GOSPEL QUESTION OF THE WEEK: How has God—Father, Son and Spirit—made His presence known to you? How would you explain this presence to a non-believer?

As Ordinary Time resumes, two "solemnities of the Lord" are celebrated on the next two



Sundays. Today's celebration of the Trinity originated in France in the eighth century and was adopted by the universal Church in 1334. The solemnity focuses on the essence of our faith: the revelation of God as Creator, the climax of His creation in Jesus the Redeemer, the fullness of the love of God poured out on us in the Sustainer Spirit. Before returning to God, the Risen Jesus commissions His fledgling Church to teach and baptize in the name of the Holy One who reveals Himself as Father, Son, and Spirit. In the Trinity we find our identity as the people of God. Many metaphors have been used to explain and depict the Trinity. St. John of Damascus, the great Eastern theologian of the eighth century, suggested that we think "of the Father as a root, the Son as a branch, and of the Spirit as a fruit, for the substance of these three is one." Today we celebrate the essence of our faith manifested in our lives: the loving providence of the Creator who continually invites us back to Him, the selfless servanthood of the Redeemer who "emptied" Himself to become like us in order that we might become like Him; the joyful love of the Spirit that is the unique unity of the Father and Son. Christ has revealed to us the depth of the Creator's love and has called us to share with one another the unique Spirit of love that unites Father and Son. As disciples of the Risen Christ, we have been called now, in our time and place, to teach what we have seen and heard, to pass on to others "everything I have commanded you" through our imitation of the Teacher's compassion, forgiveness and servanthood. The core of all of Jesus' teaching is the revelation of God as *Father* to humanity. God calls us, not as the all-powerful Creator demanding homage from the lowly slaves He created, but as a loving parent welcoming one's own children. God invites us to a relationship with Him not based on fear and judgement but centered in love, mercy and trust. Today's celebration of the Trinity confronts us with our response to God's invitation and our worthiness to be called God's "children." Explain the Trinity to your kids by analogies. As them:

The shamrock, the triangle and the fruit tree have all been used to depict the mystery of the Trinity. Are there any contemporary images that help you understand and appreciate the Triune God?

Diocese of Evansville COVID-19 Guidelines

Social-distancing is no longer required during Mass and other worship services.

For those who have been fully vaccinated, face coverings are no longer required.

Face coverings and social distancing remain strongly encouraged for those who are not fully vaccinated. This will be a matter of personal choice.

For those wishing to continue to wear face coverings (whether fully vaccinated or not) you are welcome to sit anywhere. If you wish to be seated with others wearing face coverings for your personal protection we have designated the following areas: the alcoves, balcony and cry room/vestibule at St. Ferdinand and first section of pews to the left of the handicapped entrance at St. Henry.

Except for the unique situations as described below, those who are otherwise healthy are obliged to return to Sunday Mass by the weekend of June 12-13, 2021:

- Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease (including quarantine due to exposure).
- Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issue).
- Those who are homebound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.
- Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.
- Those who are caretakers of person who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract COVID-19 virus.
