

From the desk of Fr. Steve

Dear family and friends of Holy Family and St. Mary and St. Mark Parishes,

We celebrate the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Psalmist says, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." As human beings, we are tied to our senses. If we can't detect certain stimuli with our senses, it would seem that it doesn't exist. Perhaps this is why those who want definitive proof of God's existence do not except faith as proof. People who fall into the categories of atheism and agnosticism want proof of God's existence by tangible evidence. How can we taste and see the goodness of God? Goodness in and of itself cannot be tasted nor seen. It is something immeasurable. To call something good is based on how it makes us feel or to be appreciative of what something does for us. Something good is what gives us purpose in life. When God declares something good, such as when He declares His creation good, it means that it has a purpose for His Divine Will. If we think in the spiritual sense, we can experience God's love, mercy, and compassion when we experience certain events that do not have a tie to physical phenomenon. God's goodness can be felt in both our physical and spiritual senses, but faith is required to understand God's goodness. We cannot just rely on our physical senses, but our spiritual senses as well. Both can work simultaneously, but both have to be honed in order to recognize God's presence in our day-to-day experiences.

In our first reading from the first book of Kings, we encounter the Prophet Elijah in the desert making his way to Mount Horeb. What is the story? How did Elijah end up on this journey? Remember that Elijah had been in a dispute with the priests and prophets under King Ahaz and Queen Jezebel. They did not believe in the God of Israel but rather the gods of their pagan faith. Elijah challenged them to see whether their gods or the God of Israel would be revealed when presented with a sacrificial offering. The pagan gods of their belief did not prevail but the God of Israel did and Elijah slit their throats as punishment for their blasphemy of the God of Israel. Elijah is on the run because he fears the wrath of Queen Jezebel, but he also fears the punishment of God. He is caught between a rock and a hard place because he has defended the God of Israel but will be killed by those in pursuit of him due to his actions, and yet he has violated the commandments of God by taking the lives of blasphemers. What is he to do? In the desert he is praying for death, but God has another plan for him. God sends an angel to Elijah to strengthen him on his journey to Mount Horeb. He doesn't punish Elijah, rather, He strengthens him and shows him His mercy and compassion. We feel that way at times, don't we? We feel horrible about the sins we have committed, but at the same we want to give up. We fear that God will punish us and we can't bear to disappoint God. Is it God who is punishing us, or is it we who are punishing ourselves? It shows that we truly struggle to know God.

Imagine our Gospel account today from St. John. Jesus continues His teaching about His being the Bread of Life that has come down from heaven. The Jews present in Jesus' midst murmur because they do not understand how He can be from God. They look to the things that they understand about Him. "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother?" It would be difficult for Jesus to perform any good works in the presence of those who question His existence and purpose. How can He prove that He is of God if all they know and see is that He is a man like them with a bit more understanding about God's revelations? In their eyes, He is nothing special. They want to hear from God, but yet they do not listen to Jesus. He says to them, "Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day." When scriptures say that they will be taught by God, realize that Jesus came to know Himself as the one spoken about in Sacred Scripture. Going back to His childhood and being left in Jerusalem as a young boy, Jesus read and commented on the Scriptures. He spoke among men who had years of experience reading and teaching from Sacred Scripture. How could He teach them if He is not the Word of God? St. Jerome commented that ignorance of scriptures is ignorance of Christ. We cannot know Jesus unless we read Sacred Scripture and study its day and night. We also need God's wisdom to truly understand what we are reading. In other words, as Jesus says in another place, you can do nothing without me.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Ephesians, says, "Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption." Is St. Paul speaking about another Sacrament here? Yes, he is speaking about what would later be known as the Sacrament of Confirmation. To be confirmed in the Spirit of God is to be sealed by the Spirit. Once we are baptized, we receive the Holy Spirit initially, but as we grow in the faith there comes a time when we must confess our faith in God and in His Son Jesus through the Holy Spirit. Once we receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit, there is no turning back. It is the Holy Spirit who keeps us true to God's commands and the Beatitudes of Jesus. We no longer have bitterness, fury, or anger. We no longer give in to shouting, reviling, and malice. Instead, what we grow in is compassion and forgiveness. We can't help but see God's goodness in us when we have that sense that we are forgiven of our sins. Perhaps the reason we continue to commit the same sins over and over again is because we still haven't internalized God's love, mercy, and compassion. We know we are forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance, but we have to live as people forgiven by the living God.

If we truly desire to taste and see the goodness of the Lord, may we be open to His grace to help us see how good and gracious He is towards us. May we never give up hope in God or His Son Jesus but always reflect on the greatest gift we have received in the Body and Blood of Jesus. May we also see that our redemption is at hand and that we are saved through the blood of Jesus through all humility and understanding.


