

Dear family and friends of Holy Family and St. Mary and St. Mark Parishes,

We celebrate the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Psalmist says, "Your words, Lord, are Spirit and life." How do we see God? In other words, when you picture God in your mind, what does He look like? Perhaps you see paintings depicting God as an old man with long grey hair and a long grey beard. What do these images of God depict? They depict a person of power, wisdom, and majesty. God is not human but a Divine Spirit. His very essence is being itself. This is why we cannot use the circular argument of God as a created being. If the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob were a created being, then He would be a god among other gods. It would mean that another creative being made Him, but the question is who made the being who made the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob? You see, it is a circular argument that has no end. To say that God's words have Spirit and life means that He has the power to give life to all things. Even created things that have no life perse, like rocks and mountains, still show the fingerprints of God's creative hands. I think of the connection between our minds and bodies. When there is a disconnect between our minds and bodies, our bodies cannot move because our joints, muscles, and ligaments cannot move the bones that put us into motion without being connected to the mind. The mind is a product of our very being. It is connected to our souls. The Church teaches us that our spirit and body are interconnected, but when we die, our spirit is disconnected from our body and it is the body that dies. To have the Spirit of God means that He willed us into existence. This is why His words have power.

In our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Nehemiah, we hear about the priest Ezra who brought the law of God before the assembly gathered at the Water Gate of the Temple. What was the occasion? We do not know the context from this passage of what the occasion was, but what we do know is that Ezra was renewing for the people gathered the significance of the law and the importance for them to follow what God had given them. We can surmise that because this event took place at the opening to the Temple area, it was the place where sacrifices were made to the Lord. What Ezra is reminding the people of are the good things God had done for them. Having the Prophet Nehemiah with him gave him strength that what he was giving to the people would strengthen them to stay close to the Lord and not abandon Him. It was the words of God that caused them to act with supplication and thanksgiving, but it also caused them to worship and praise God. Nehemiah tells the people not to be sad and not to weep, but "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our LORD." It is often the case in our lives that when we have been spared of some tragic event or something good, we have not expected, comes into our lives that we shout with joy and thanksgiving to the Lord. What happens when everything is going well in our lives, or we are not in fear of some calamity that could come our way, or there is seemingly peace in our lives? We seem to turn away from God or barely mention His name. What the Prophet Nehemiah and the priest Ezra are instructing the people to do is to give constant praise, worship, and thanks to God in every situation, place, and time.

In the Gospel of Luke, we hear that the Evangelist wrote his account of the events in Jesus' life in order to give a more accurate account of what Jesus said and did among His disciples. He is writing to Theophilus, who was perhaps a recent convert to the Way of Jesus. The name Theophilus translates to son of God, which means that this man was baptized into the life of Jesus. He needed further instruction to keep him on the path of discipleship in Jesus and to become a steward of the gifts he received through the Holy Spirit. What Luke begins with is the event of Jesus coming back to Nazareth, His hometown, and standing before the people gathered in the synagogue reading from the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah. What Isaiah declares about the Messiah to come is that he was anointed to being good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, and to let the oppressed go free. When Jesus finishes reading the scroll, rolling it up and giving it to the attendant, and sitting down, the people looked intently at Him. Jesus says to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." They are reminded once again that the words of God have power and effect in their lives. What Jesus reveals to them is that His authority comes from above because He is the author of life. His words have effect on everyone He speaks to because He is the Word of God. Whether a person believes in Jesus or not, it cannot be denied that everyone hears the Word of God and either chooses to receive it and put it into action or reject it and do nothing.

In our second reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, Paul compares the reliance of unity among believers in Christ to the body and its many parts. As my mother experienced her stroke and the challenges ahead to recovering the use of her speech and mobility, my sister and I are learning day by day just how important the human brain is to directing all the signals within the human body to cause us to experience the senses of taste, touch, smell, hearing, and sight.

Our bodies are amazing things, and the complexity by which all of our organs, muscles, tendons, cartilage, joints, and bones work in tandem with the circulatory system, pulmonary system, and neurological system. God has certainly created us with an amazing plan in mind. He has created us to put into action our bodies, with all the complexities of what occurs within our bodies to sustain life. outwardly towards unity with others who have been created as we were in the image and likeness of God. When Paul uses the human body as an example for the unity necessary in our faith, he proposes that all the elements and systems that make up the human body are interdependent on the other, and in our faith and connection with the Church we are to be one as the persons of the Holy Trinity in God are one. What causes disunity in the Church and among its members? It is the introduction of evil into something good. If we think about it, God created us in goodness, so it would seem that we would be incapable of committing evil acts, but we do when we sin. Sin is the product of pride in most cases, and it causes us to mar the image of God within us. The same can be said when the life of Christ resides in us. If we have received Christ but allow sin to overtake us, then we cannot do the good that we desire to do.

In all things, let us put on the armor of Christ to keep us united to one another and the Church


