

## Dear Blessed Sacrament Families & Friends,



## 2020 Contribution

The IRS requires a receipt to prove a charitable contribution of \$250.00 each or more. For contributions less than \$250, the IRS will accept your canceled check as proof. This rule applies to one time gifts of \$250 or more, not the cumulative total for the year. Also, our books have to be turned over to 2021 on January 1st. We must receive your last contribution for 2020 by Dec 31, 2020. Any checks received after Dec 31st, but dated before, will not be recorded for 2020.


