


Saint Meinrad Archabbey and Seminary & School of Theology have been preparing Church leaders for the Diocese of Evansville, and the world, since 1857.

IT TAKES ALL KINDS

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride

and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

REMEMBRANCE CROSSES FROM SAINT JOSEPH PEWS

We are ready to take pre-orders for crosses that have been made with wood from our church pews! These crosses will be available in two sizes, 12" and 18". The finish has been kept intact, and they are laser-engraved with the monogram of Saint Joseph on the front, as well as the date and Saint Joseph church on the back. They will be pre-drilled for wall hanging, and because of woodgrain variation in oak, there will be a variety of woodgrains on the crosses.

Because of the limited number of crosses being made, you may order one size, or one of each per registered family of Saint Joseph Church. Once we are able to fill all pre-orders with crosses, we will then address any remaining crosses we may have (assuming we have some left).

The 12" crosses will be offered at \$50 each, and the 18" larger cross will be \$125. Because of the limited supply of crosses, pre-payment will be required to ensure your reservation of your cross(s). Check, money order, or credit-card are payment options. Of course, we would welcome any additional donation you may want to make to help us cover the cost of producing and offering these to you.

To preorder, attend a mass on the weekend of January 23rd (Saturday afternoon and Sunday masses). We will be displaying cross samples in the lobby of the Parish Center, and individuals will help you pre-order them. Unfortu-



nately, if we have preorders to for all of the anticipated crosses as the masses, we will have to stop taking orders. You will then be placed on a wait list in hopes of getting more crosses.

If you are unable to attend, you may call the Parish Center, (812) 482-1805, starting Monday (January 24, 2022) and pre-order them if they are still available. We will not accept orders prior to the opening of the preorder event on Saturday evening.

Credit card payment will be required to preorder by phone.

All income exceeding expenses will be forwarded to the "Our Time" Capital Campaign.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 16, 2022 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! 


