# SAINT BONIFACE

#### JUNE 5

St. Boniface (baptismal name Winfred) was born near the year 680 in England. Overcoming the disapproval of his family, he was able to pursue a career in the Church. He was educated at Benedictine Monasteries and became a priest at age 30. St. Boniface became a missionary and brought the Christian faith to the Frankish Empire (modern-day Germany) during the eighth century. After his return to England, Wynfrid was chosen to be the abbot of his monastery. Still wishing to evangelize, he turned down the position and proceeded to Rome in 718. There, he met with Pope Gregory II, who gave him the name Boniface. He eventually became the first archbishop of Mainz.

St. Boniface is the patron saint of Germany, and popularly known as the "Apostle of the Germans." He and 52 other missionaries were martyred in 755, and their remains now rest at Fulda Cathedral in Germany, a pilgrimage site that is still popular today.



#### Greetings,

This weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday; the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and our parish picnic. They go together because of relationships. Let us give glory and praise to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When I reflect on the Trinity, we have this God who is made up of three persons of

equal relationship and form a community of love. They interact freely with neither one being dominant over the other one or two. They are in a relationship, so they form this divine community. We become part of the Trinity when we build up relationships. Truly, we build community when we work together and care for each other. Let us always praise God and share it with community then we reflect the Trinity.

Today, we celebrate our Parish Picnic on our grounds with food and games. I am truly looking forward to this celebration. The parish didn't have a social when I was here the first time sixteen years ago. I believe this is a well-oiled machine with the activities and booths taking place. Scott and Allison Brandt are the Chairpersons of the event. From our organizational meeting until now, people know their responsibilities and get the job done. I thank Scott and Allison Brandt for taking the responsibility to chair this celebration. I am grateful for the booth chairpersons too. I truly thank all of you for supporting the parish picnic and making this a huge success. I thank our Hispanic community too for offering your Hispanic Cuisine. Muchas Gracias! It is great that we can mingle together and get to know each other. With the picnic, we changed our 9:00am Mass to bilingual and we will not celebrate the 10:30am Spanish Mass. We will still have the Sunday evening Mass at 6:00pm.

We also have another big event for our Diocese this weekend on Saturday, June 3rd as Deacon Stephen Patrick McGinnis will be ordained to the priesthood at St. Benedict's Cathedral. Deacon Stephen is from St. Bernard's parish in Rockport. He will be assigned as the parochial vicar of St. Francis Xavier Parish in Vincennes and St. Philip Neri Parish in Bicknell. Also in clergy news, Fr. Darnis Selvanayakam is assigned to St. Joseph, and he will be a fulltime priest. I have some ideas for pastoral ministry. These appointments will take place on Wednesday, June 28, 2023. Keep praying for vocations.

Next week, we will have the Corpus Christi Procession after the 4:30pm Saturday Mass. Fr. Christian and Pam Freyberger are planning the event, and they will erect altars for the processional route to visit and pray. You might remember the procession last year or years ago when the parish processed behind Jesus in the Monstrance around the campus. This year, we have Eucharistic Renewal to rekindle the fire of the Eucharist in our hearts. We can also have other Eucharistic devotions by spending time in prayer, visit Adoration, attend daily Mass, and make a Holy Hour. It doesn't hurt to spend some quiet time with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration or just sitting in church. Some quiet time is good for the body and the soul! Maybe, we can give all that busyness to the Lord while we pray and rest. Plan to take some time each day for prayer. You will see the difference in your lives.


