Today, the Sunday between Christmas and New Year, is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. As you know, Christmas does not end on December 25; that is the date that it begins! The Christmas Season lasts from Christmas Eve through the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. During these weeks, there are many great feasts, people, and events that we celebrate! These days are filled with joy – not just today's feast of the Holy Family, but also the great days of the Holy Innocents; St. John; St. Sylvester; the Feast of Mary, Mother of God on January 1; the American Saints Elizabeth Ann Seton and John Neumann; the Holy Name of Jesus, and of course, next week, the great feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, when Christ is revealed to all the nations.

Christmas occurs at the darkest time of the year; the winter solstice has just passed, the day when the darkness is as its peak. Now our northern hemisphere of the earth turns toward the sun, and the days will become progressively longer and warmer. As much as I love Christmastime, I must say that I prefer the summertime with its light and warmth! But even now, at the start of wintertime, we have hope, because Christmastime is the beginning of that turning toward the light and the warmth; there is no turning back! So it is most appropriate, and very well planned out, that during this time we celebrate Christmas, the birth of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World!

In the 4th century, St. Gregory of Nyssa wrote:

Today the darkness begins to grow shorter and the light to lengthen, as the hours of night become fewer. Nor is it an accident that this change occurs on the solemn day when divine life is manifested! Rather, to those who are attentive, nature manifests itself through visible things to a new reality. I seem to hear her saying, "Realize as you observe these phenomena, that the invisible is being manifested to you through the visible." You see, do you not, that night has reached its greatest length, and since it can advance no farther, comes to a halt and withdraws? Do you see that the beams of light are more intense and the sun higher than it has been? Realize that the true light is now here, and, through the rays of the gospel, is illuminating the whole earth!

Jesus Christ, born today, said, "I am the Light of the World!" But Jesus also said to his disciples, and says to us, "You are the Light of the World!" Let us celebrate the Light during these days! During these weeks of Christmas, keep your Christmas lights burning brightly, celebrate with your family and friends, and most importantly, let your light shine so that others may see your good works and give glory to God!

During this week between Christmas and New Year, the Parish Offices will be closed, to give our dedicated staff time to celebrate with their family and friends. If you have parish business, please take care of that after the New Year holiday. Speaking of the New Year, next Saturday, January 1, is the Feast of Mary, Mother of God, but this is not a holy day of obligation this year. Still, all are invited to celebrate Mary and welcome the New Year at Mass next Saturday at 9:00 a.m. There will be no afternoon Confessions or 4:30 p.m. Mass.

Big News for the Parish!

Dear Friends,

I am pleased to announce the creation of a new endowment to benefit St. Margaret of Scotland Parish through the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri. This fund has been established with my support and the advice and support of our Parish Finance Advisory Committee.



Archbishop Carlson created the Foundation and it has been further endorsed by Archbishop Rozanski. It is a separate 501(c)(3) organization from the Archdiocese of St. Louis and has been designated as the long -term financial and planned giving resource to the parishes, schools and ministries of the Archdiocese. After a mere 7 years in existence, the Foundation has more than 225 individual funds and more than \$68 million dollars under management.

The endowment will provide an annual distribution to the parish, which will be used for general support of the parish. The fund is perpetual and will provide on-going income to our parish for generations to come.

Additions to the fund can be made by anyone, at any time, and in any amount. Therefore, I encourage you to consider making gifts to the endowment through the Roman Catholic Foundation for birthdays, memorials, anniversaries, or any other special event. You can also make a planned gift, which will be added to the endowment after your lifetime!

GROWING IN FAITH

Merry Christmas, and Happy Feast of the Holy Family!

When I think about the Church celebrating this feast on this day, several thoughts fly to mind:

- Of course it makes sense to celebrate this blessed family immediately after it was formed through the birth of Jesus.
- § Of course it makes sense to celebrate families at Christmas at what other time are we so grateful to have our families than at Christmas?
- What a funny time to celebrate families at what other time are we most ready for our families to go back where they came from?!

But after smirking to myself, a more reflective thought rises to mind: What a perfect Feast for us to learn about who God, who this newborn Christ Child, truly is.

God is all-powerful. He could have saved the world in any myriad of ways, but He chose to do it by becoming one of us. Further, He could have become incarnate in the world in any way He wished (it might have been simpler to just come as an adult and get right to the saving part), but he entered as a newborn child. He entered our world as a member of a family, embedded in a specific, historical community.

I have known my whole life that our God is a Triune God - a God in three persons. But it wasn't until I was an adult that I learned that this truth teaches us about the attributes of God. Specifically, our God - one person in three - is a God made for relationship and community. And humans, being made in God's image and likeness, are also made for relationship and community. In fact, in the first moments of human existence during the creation of the world, God looks at the singular man He has made and says, "It is not good for [humans] to be alone." (Gen 2:18). For the most part, we are at our best when we are living and working in relationship with others.

And now I look at the Holy Family in a new way: God didn't come to the world as a single, adult human who just lived and acted on His own, because that's not who God is. He came as a child, raised by a family, integrated into a community which would provide support and relationship and background for His life here on Earth, because that is where God finds his fullest expression (if there can be a most full expression of a thing which can never be diminished...). That's also where humans find the fullest expression of our humanity. And Jesus, both fully human and fully divine, would undoubtedly be the same.



So today, I celebrate the newborn Christ Child. I celebrate our God who made us like Himself, meant to be loved and to love others. I celebrate the most Holy Family which Mary and Joseph made to nurture and raise our God Incarnate. And I celebrate the holiness, goodness, and dignity embedded in every family here on Earth, and the holiness, goodness, and dignity they create in each of us. Happy feast, everyone.
